

ELVIS PRESLEY, since the day I met him, has been and is one of my most enjoyable and worthwhile friendships in this business. At the same time, rewarding, he has become the costliest and the most time-consuming celebrity I have ever known. The reason: Fortunately, and I say this with real appreciation, I have been adopted by many of his millions of fans, who know that I know Elvis. And more important, that I always write the truth about him, and what he says — which is "bible" to them. At the same time reading their letters sometimes as many as 1,500 a month, and at times as many as 3,000 is the most time consuming job I've ever encountered. Especially since I read them after working hours — since I am not paid for this, and I try to answer as many as possible — which I cannot do without hiring another full-time secretary to take over the Elvis replies. As it is, I take a batch of Elvis letters to bed with me every night. The letters reveal the inflammable Elvis Magic which provides the profound loyalty and hero worship that "The King of Rock and Roll" holds these dozen years or more.

Elvis has been the objective of more adulation from his generation and more complaints from his preceding generation who didn't understand, than any idol since Valentino. In reading the Latin lover's biography, his preceding generation took plenty of brick bats at the suave Italian charmer. He was labeled "The Pink Powder Puff" by a Chicago editor, less appreciative of his appeal.

This hasn't happened to Elvis because it is well known he is a karate and judo expert. Elvis can handle himself or a half dozen like him in the art of self-defense. However, he stays away from public crowds — so "No-

body'll get hurt." Think about it, and you'll fully understand the rationality of this decision on his part and his mentor, Col. Tom Parker. Too, anyone who picks on Elvis might face a wrathful delegation of more than angry women, the thought of which would cause the average male editor to crawl under his desk in self-defense.

Each time an Elvis Presley story hits the stands under my byline hundreds of letters from Elvis' followers arrive anew. And since recently some of the critics have turned detractors on some of his movies, claiming they are "routine" and "Elvis is in a rut," I have selected a few to share with you, so you'll know how "the hip" and the kids of Elvis' generation feel about him. If "Mr. Jack Cortez Dear" had the space of a Los Angeles telephone directory, I could fill it with these Elvis Presley letters. Some have red, white and blue stickers as this one which read:

"MR. GREAT HIMSELF. OUR BIG "E" FROM TENNESSEE. ELVIS RECORDS GROSSED 150 MILLION. ELVIS MOVIES HAVE GROSSED 130 MILLION." Now there are thousands of fan clubs for Elvis; many send lifetime membership cards like "ELVIS OUR GUARDIAN ANGEL" from Huntington Beach, California. The letters not only express the writers' true feelings about Elvis, that he is exemplary, inspirational with admiration for his integrity, his honor, his kindness, besides his music, his good looks, etc., etc., etc. . . . Some relate actually seeing Elvis!

One wrote he visited Elvis' father and family, and Mr. Presley had taken him on a walk along a foot path through his back yard, under a fence which led into Elvis' estate, "Grace-

land." He enjoyed the garden, seeing the beautiful air-conditioned modern cages for Elvis' animal pets — like a dream zoo. He visited the office where Elvis' business and volumes of mail are handled. He walked up the back porch steps to the kitchen and chatted with Elvis inside, at breakfast. Others relate seeing his new home here in a Beverly Hills canyon. One girl's boyfriend was a workman at Elvis' place and he had come away with a glowing report of the decor, vivid colors and beauty which Elvis, himself, had designed. Then there are the visitors to California — from "back home in Tennessee" whom Elvis "invites to his home for talk, music, and eats." Sometimes there will be a hundred people milling about, and Elvis comes out of his study and greets everyone, spends an hour or so and then disappears, telling everyone to be content. His staff of twelve, referred to as the "Memphis Mafia" — keep things running smoothly and hospitable.

A young woman from Columbus,

Ohio writes:

"Elvis is my favorite entertainer. He has given me many hours of listening pleasure and his movies are almost the only ones I attend anymore. I've had the great pleasure of meeting Mr. Presley, in person, about five years ago in Memphis. My girlfriend and I were treated most cordially. I've always read everything I could find to read about Elvis, so therefore was impressed with the many times you've written articles about him and others of his family. I found the many things you have written about him to be quite true. Mr. Presley has been the greatest factor in my seeking God. When I read of his faith which is the Pentecostal faith and heard what fine people the Presleys were, and I realized that here was an entertainer of the highest calibre who was not ashamed of being brought up in the Assembly of God church, I found this profound. You see I was brought up in this faith but fell away from it for a number of

FOR THREE DAYS NOW we have been alerted for a "tornado watch" by the radio and TV and it has been exciting to say the least. Thunder storms every night that rattle the cottage and dishes like the earthquakes in California. The lightning is so sharp and constant, I hardly need to turn on the electric lights, with so much window space and open porches. Rains have been heavy and the days quite hot — at last.

Most of you remember my guests, Ray and Sonne Griffin, who spent a couple of weeks with me in Las Vegas this past spring. All the Discomforts of Home

Business offices were once regarded primarily as places in which to work. They were well lighted, well ventilated, orderly and antiseptic. Efficiency and austerity reigned supreme. This was before the Hollywood Era and interior decorators. Today, under the impetus of cost-plus contracts and excess profits taxes, most executive offices are designed along the lines of a botanical garden or the boudoir of Madame du Barry.

Basic equipment includes a chaise lounge, a built-in bar, a putting green and a lily pond. Some of the effects are a little startling to old school executives. There is a strict rule among interior decorators that no two walls be painted the same color.

As for furnishings, the trick is not to have anything look like what it is. Chairs resemble wheel barrows and the inkwells are probably ashtrays in disguise. Desks may look like snack bars or pingpong tables but, perish forbid, not like anything to work on.





Eat Treat: While dining at the

Life Magazine once had a picture of it on its cover. National Geographic also did a full feature story with Frank Gudridge on its cover. These shacks on the ice are really something. Many are carpeted, have TV's and Hi-Fi's, oil heaters and all the comforts of home where even the gals go and spend entire days playing bridge along with watching their

lines in the hole in the ice for the bobber to signal that they have a catch of a Wall-eye or Northern pike. It is a way of life, new to this continent, which is fast becoming almost as popular as other winter sports. And it is as popular with the women as with the men folks.

After our dinner at Hazelglade, Ray, Sonne and I drove completely around Mille Lacs Lake, so huge you cannot see across it.
