chief for La Fiesta Theatre Restaurant in Juarez, Mexico.



Three shots ripped out and I was off on the wildest adventure of my life. Now that I have your attention, let's pursue other outlets of escapism.

This week, I thought we'd take a look at two of the most popular bands in the land . . . **Guy Lombardo** and **Duke Ellington** . . . both of whom opened this past week. The Duke at the Flamingo Hotel's Lounge and Guy in the Tropicana's Blue Room.

Believe it or not, there's room for comparison. Both bands have maintained the same distinctive sound for some forty odd years. Both have also retained most of the original sidemen that started on the road to success back in the Twenties. Both bands have played for Presidents and Kings — all over the world. But, there the comparison ends. Duke is the composer, the ultimate leader, under-rated piano player and leader of the most popular jazz band of all times.

**Guy Lombardo** and brothers **Carmen**, **Victor** and **Liebert** have cornered the market on the sweet, easy to listen to, special brand of play-the-melody-only style of music. I have to respect this man for doing what he does better than anyone else. Listening to Guy on opening night, I first noticed the age group in the room was, on an average, over forty, extremely attentive, constantly tapping toes. Whenever Guy announced songs like "Boo Hoo," "Third Man Theme," "You Are My Sunshine" and other tuneful chestnuts, the audience "Ahhhh" as though Guy was playing only to them and no one else. Lombardo looked very healthy and well rested after his recent heart surgery. When announcing the band's next number, he did just that . . . no at-

tempt at being cute or funny. With Guy, his music speaks for itself. **Kenny Gardner** sings the song without any attempt to dethrone **Sinatra** or **Eckstine** as a stylist. The audience, especially the ladies, found Kenny the type of boy they'd like bringing them their evening paper and calling on their daughter for the school prom. Guy gave the people some twenty two tunes.

Midway in the show, Lombardo introduced pretty **Renee Armand**. **Renee** was last seen here with **Woody Herman** and his Herd. She brought the audience from tuneful nostalgia to the swinging sixties. Wearing a micro mini skirt, she quickly went into songs that have all been on the top forty charts. At first, the opening nighters were a bit distant but by the time **Renee** broke in with "Alfie," the people were with her. My only complaint . . . she's not on long enough. But, the Lombardo fans came to hear Guy and they weren't disappointed. The **Royal Canadians** will be here for four more weeks. Knowing the **Lombardo** cult . . . it will be four packed weeks.

Down the Strip to the Flamingo, where the **Duke of Ellington** and his band of merry men also opened. Opening night, as the band came onstage, I noticed the absence of anchor man **Harry Carney**, **Paul Gonsalves**, and the spark, **Cootie Williams**. In town for the opening, **Leonard Feather** informed me that Carney and Gonsalves were late but would make the second show. **Pat Brown**, the Duke's pretty P.R. lady, explained that Cootie is recovering from minor surgery and would be back in ten days. 
