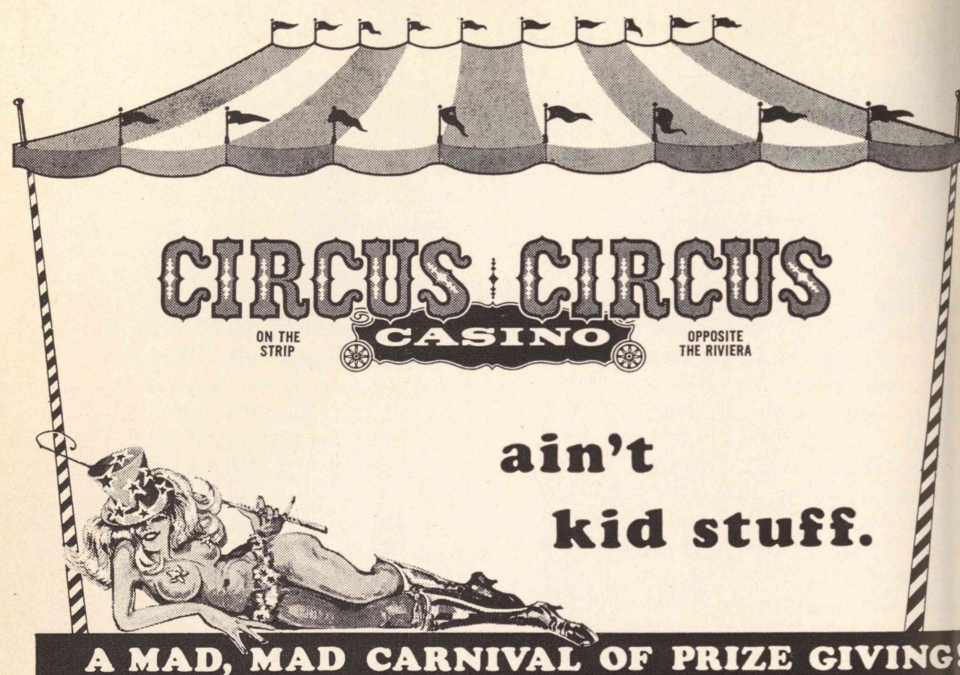


NATIONAL CAT WEEK is celebrated annually in November in this country. "To publicize that special event the world's No. 1 celebrated cat **Princess** paid a visit to Mayor Sam Yorty and Deputy Mayor **Eleanor Chambers** at City Hall where **Princess** 'meeeowed' her message at his press conference for the television cameras, and posed in front of the City of Los Angeles Official Seal and the flags, with Deputy Mayor **Chambers** holding her, while Mayor Yorty petted her. **Ella Cummings** and **Serena Sande** of the **Pet Assistance Foundation** representing cat lovers beamed their approval." Thus read the caption on the photos appearing in five column cuts in newspapers throughout the world.

"**Rhubarb**" (who was actually several-look-alike cats in the movies) was succeeded by "**Room Eight**" as premiere **Feline** — and then along came **Miss Movie Star Princess** who has starred in pictures and has appeared at countless charity events to help raise money for the needy. Last week she was the guest star at Mr. **Blackwell's** champagne fashion show where she performed and was presented a life membership by the **Pet Assistance Foundation**. As **Lynn Spencer** (her scrap books show full page and half page and all sorts of interviews and stories on her) has chronicled in his **Herald Examiner** column, **Deputy Mayor Eleanor Chambers** became **Princess's** godmother after they rode in the **Santa Claus Parade** where the pink and white Siamese pussycat was acclaimed by throngs of people. Her owner suddenly became known as "the girl with that beautiful pink and white cat."

National Cat Week means much more than an extra saucer of cream for your pet. There are millions of cats thrown out in the streets to die

of starvation, be killed, be picked up for torture in vivisection torture chambers until death mercifully releases them from their pain. Cats are declared to be the most intelligent of all animals, and the most independent. **President John F. Kennedy**, **President Roosevelt**, **Churchill** — so many of our world leaders and intellectuals have chosen cats as their personal daily companions. **Cat Week** is to remind everyone of the need for help for millions of kittens who are born into this world to be strangled or drowned or worse, before they even get to see it. God created them. Too many people unaware or unthinking take playful kittens as playthings, and throw them out the door or drop them in the mountains where wild animals can eat them — and more, too shocking to report. A friend heard a dull thud on her apartment house wall. She went out to find a cat that had been thrown from a car, lying there with its back broken, and other horrible internal injuries. She took the cat to the vet, and it was eight months before it could walk. It has become her devoted companion. I could relate hundreds of cases. People like **Mrs. Cummings** of the **Pet Assistance**, answer calls, as do many other private individuals, as well as small groups to help homeless cats. Many people who can't afford it, share their food with cats, who come to their back door — their little emaciated starving bodies — skin and bones. It takes so little money to help a pussycat. **Princess** has dedicated her earnings and her ability as a performer to help. She gets so many requests she should be a dozen pussycats with a manager and a private secretary. If you can help starving helpless pussycats please do. Call any of the **Cat Assistance** leagues in your vicinity. Care and help for dogs is well and strongly organized



throughout the world. Whereas cats — who were idolized in Egypt in the days of **Cleopatra**, do not have a cat shelter in a city like Los Angeles. Many warm hearted human beings take them into their homes — and go without food themselves to help, rather than see them starving to death and turn them away.

It is **Princess'** dream to raise a hundred thousand dollars to have one Cat Shelter at least in Los Angeles equipped with x-ray and the necessary hospital equipment to take care of the injured. **Princess'** miraculous recovery to health with the faith of **Bishop Wallace** of the **Mormon Church**, and the unceasing devotion, work and skill of **Dr. Samuel Tasker**, the noted M.D. and skin specialist, who saved her life — has brought about this dedication. In life you want to give back some of the goodness that has been given to you. So it is with **Princess** and her dream of a Shelter for homeless, suffering, starving and sick pussycats who have no owners — and are left in the streets

and in the deserts, or are taken to the pounds or one of the vicious cruel torture chambers. Foremost doctors say such cruelty is not necessary. Look in a cats eyes — and you see human intelligence. For those who have, or who do mistreat them — how heavy must be the burden of guilt and murder.

On the happier side of National Cat Week, **Princess** gave a meeeowing and purring party at her home with liver salad, salmon sandwiches, turkey breast layer cake and ice cream. Among those enjoying it all were Pet Assistance Foundation executives, **Jet**, the playmate of **Princess**, who is a golden persian, and **Mustachio**, a black and white persian who arrived from Canoga Park with his owner **Larry Trench**, who is a life (about to be **Eagle Scout** in full uniform. Little **Tony Cimber** the three-year-old-baby son of the late **Jayne Mansfield** was a special guest, who came with his nice new mama **Mrs. Matt Cimber**. FABULOUS LAS VEGAS

Lights of Las Vegas

OFTEN IMITATED, but seldom duplicated, **DEAN MARTIN**, "Mr. Box Office of Show Business," will return to the **Sands Hotel** on Tuesday night Nov. 5 for a two week engagement.

There will be no surprises in store for the show going public as **Martin** hasn't any new plans to spring for this date. As a matured artist, he captures an audience just by entering the stage. The public of all ages has accepted him what he is today and entertainers hail him as an all-time favorite with his casual style.

Martin contends, probably with tongue in cheek, that performing in Las Vegas, movies and television are his "sidelines" or hobbies. He makes an excellent living from his Hobbies but there's no record that he's been compensated for his real "career."

"What I really work at is golf."

Each morning before taping his TV show **Martin** plays a round of golf. He is constantly swinging a golf club on movie sets.

A large factor in his success of show business has been the very casualness of his approach, coupled with expert showmanship.

Martin, born **Dino Crocetti** in Steubenville, Ohio, didn't exactly rush into show business. He tried boxing, pumped gas and dealt cards in gambling casinos before turning to singing.

This pillar well remembers **Martin** breaking in as a singer with **Sammy Watkins orchestra** in Cleveland, Ohio, at **Vogue Room** of **Hollenden Hotel** in the middle 30's, getting \$25 a week and tickled to get it.

In 1946, **Martin** and another then unknown entertainer, **Jerry Lewis**, were both carving a mild living in


show business as separate acts. That year they teamed up for the first time at 500 Club in Atlantic City. Their zany brand of music and comedy soon catapulted them to national fame. They were a hit in nightclubs, made 16 movies together and performed on top TV shows.

After 10 years together the pair decided to go their separate way in 1956, some skeptics thought **Martin** was through. With his smash record, "That's Amore" (three million sales), under his belt, **Martin** wasn't hurting and soon proved to be good box office at movie theatres.

Last year **Martin** received two special awards: a **Golden Globe** from the **Hollywood Foreign Press Association** as "Most Popular Television Personality" of the year and the **Academy of Country-Western Music's** award as their "Man of the Year."

Sands entertainment director **Jack Entratter** wishes he had 10 entertainers like **Martin**, then the booking problems would be over.
