





FABULOUS LAS VEGAS

Lights of Las Vegas

AFTER FOUR months of negotiation Barbra Streisand signed one of the richest nightclubs contracts to open the \$60 million International Hotel. This fact will make her the highest paid performer on the smart supper club circuit for a total of 20 weeks.

Martin Erlichman, the star's personal manager and Alex Shookey, general manager of the International, jointly announced the signing of a five year contract calling for a four week engagement each year. Salary was not revealed, but the rumored figure of \$250,000 a week is not true.

Shookey and his entertainment director Bill Miller claim that Miss Streisand's earnings will far exceed anything ever paid a performer here. All the smart money put her salary somewhere in excess of \$100,000 a week.

This marks her first appearance in the resort city since 1961, where she was a supporting attraction at the Riviera Hotel with Liberace as headliner. Miss Streisand received \$5,000 a week at that time.

Yours truly occupied a both opening night with Riviera execs Harvey Silbert and the late Benny Goffstein. They picked up Miss Streisand's option immediately after the first show. The Riviera hasn't released her from the previous commitment, as she has a few weeks to go on the contract.

According to Miller, the female vocalist will provide the entertainment package, including a musical conductor with the hotel providing a 30 piece orchestra, plus all the extras.

The projected opening date is being planned for July 3 in the 2,000 seat theatrical palace with the International having a hold on the stellar attraction until September.

Plans at the newly constructed hotel

calls for a superstar policy which will include a legit theatre housing dramas and comedies. First few shows will be from Broadway and in the future will produce their own. The intimate theatre will seat close to 900 people.

Miss Streisand will do one show at the premiere and two shows nightly thereafter. Opening night will be a spectacular occasion, with guests from around the world in attendance.

The hotel towers have reached the 27th story level with only two floors to go. Two shifts a day are working to complete it on target date and some subcontractors are working around the clock.

International Hotel and its innovations will be the conversation place of the world when it's completed.

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



REVIEWS WHO: John Gary has been brought along with care and concern by a know how manager named Joe Csida, an old friend. Thus, today he is a depurative delineator of songs. No muddled moments, just straight singing. He still has choir boy falsetto notes at his command; on the whole his tones are lower and fuller than before. And his hair is a shade darker than in his last Persian Room appearance. Plaza patrons are treated to a bunch of contemporary tunes, a medley from the indestructible "Student Prince," an imitation of John Wayne, a touch of "Maleguena Sole Rose" with appropriate self accompaniment on the guitar — like Tito Guizar used to do and some light barrelhouse moments with "Georgia." The summation — it's an hour of easy-to-take songology by a likeable young pro.

I am truly sorry that I did not get to write about the Julie London show at the Blue Room of the Tropicana Hotel. Julie was better than I have ever seen her since she began coming to Las Vegas. And Joey Villa has to be one of the big comedy stars of tomorrow. Next time the gorgeous London comes to our town, I promise I will devote a half page just singing her praises.

By the time you read this, Guy Lombardo will have opened. More about him next week.

A word about Angelo Picardi, appearing at Nero's Nook. The Dunes may have Rouvaun, but Caesars has Picardi. First of all, he is personable and according to some of the gals in attendance, quite a looker. His voice at times sounds as if he were going onstage at the met yet, at other times, he sounds like a superior "pop" singer. This is due to his good choice of material ranging from Jim Webb to "The Man Of La Mancha." Naturally, he sings "The Impossible Dream" as his voice is so well suited to this type of song. The audience especially liked the idea of Angelo sitting on the apron of the stage and singing just to them. This guy has quite a future ahead of him. Would like to see and hear him in one of the Broadway shows that play here. Good musical comedy material in Angelo Picardi. See him.

The explosion you heard last week at the Flamingo was not an H-bomb being detonated, but the wild one with the blonde hair returned at the Casino Theater. Who else but Wayne

Cochran and the C.C. Riders. Whether you dig R&B or "soul" music, you will be paralyzed by Cochran's onslaught. The C.C. Riders, all fourteen of them, open the show with a magnificent display of jazz and pop. The highlight is their arrangement of "Eleanor Rigby," countered with "Hey Jude," both Beatle tunes. The only other band that can top them for sheer excitement is Woody's. But Woody's band doesn't have to cope with choreography. After the C.C. Riders warm up the crowd, out he comes, hits you between the eyes and doesn't let up for the next hour. Wayne's voice is not of the Sinatra or Damone caliber, but then Sinatra and Damone couldn't do what Wayne does either. After getting the audience to sing along with him and giving out with a little bit of his philosophy on life, Wayne and the Riders parade through the entire audience getting the crowd to clap and seat along with him. By this time, everyone is at a feverish pitch begging for more but Wayne is a smart showman. He begs off to screams, with everyone wanting more. As I said . . . R&B or "soul" music may not be your bag, but you may wind up a convert to Wayne Cochran.

Still at the Flamingo, Slappy White is back and again he shows why he is unique among comedians. Slappy does not carry a chip on his shoulder or venom in his remarks. He is just plain funny with only minor references to racial stories. You hear Slappy and you know where most of the other comedians got their jokes. Every joke Slappy tells is his, even if it goes back a few years. But hearing Slappy tell them, they sound like new.
