FABULOUS LAS VEGAS



THE 14TH ANNUAL Oscarette Awards were presented at the Wilshire Ebell in colorful ceremonies attended by state and civic leaders, with famed California's Jr. Philharmonic Orchestra, with conductor-founder Dr. Ernst Katz, and your columnist as award chairman, participating.

Dr. Katz' Jr. Philharmonic, whose revolving membership in the thirty-two years numbers over 3600 of California's finest musicians of teen age. They audition annually to play in the 110-piece symphony which has played over 600 concerts for charity events. It was fourteen years ago at the Wilshire Ebell that token awards were made to Natalie Wood, Sal Mineo and Jimmy Dean, new young unknown stars, who — I remember I said in the introduction — would be well known when their picture "Rebel Without A Cause" would be released three months hence. They were delighted to light the birthday cake and Sal Mineo returned years later to receive his hard-won Oscarette for his role in "Exodus."

To salute new talent in the acting field as well as the musical, for both goes hand in hand, Dr. Katz agreed to share the Orchestra's birthday celebration annually and co-sponsor the Oscarettes. Stardom is the goal of all. Some receive recognition, some receive Oscars, and some pay high powered press agents to publicize them. More make the valiant effort, try, get discouraged, and give up. And as the old Westerns say, "fade into the sunset" of Hollywood Blvd. For those who have it, have the drive, character, ambition, and guts to make it, to keep on trying harder even when they are making it, the Oscarette is a symbol of success. It is the on-the-way mark for young stars who may in years to come win an Oscar. And believe me, they are mighty proud to

receive it, for it is based purely on merit. No politics or favoritism.

To add glamour and to extend appreciation of world-famous stars in all entertainment media, their names are placed in nomination for voting by the teenagers. The results are often surprising. For example, Agnes Moorehead won an overwhelming majority for a TV series rather than the popular star Elizabeth Montgomery for "Bewitched."

The Oscarettes have plenty of civic and state pride and cooperation, and no funds, since neither Dr. Katz nor I have asked. We use what money we can afford, but more importantly, the time and pressures of weeks of work each year, putting on what approximates more work than my TV show did last year. Our aim however is to compliment, and encourage youth who do not make the front pages like militant lawless teenagers. And, in a measure, the Oscarettes, which are constructive, pay back to Hollywood in enrichment for what it has given everyone.

The Oscarette Award, which is unique and especially designed, was named when Dr. Katz suggested I name the award. My papa's name was Oscar and as an only child he called me his "Little Oscarette." Thus the title. It is a welcome twist to turn the spotlight away from delinquents to talented young people who persevere to accomplish their ideals in this rebellious troubled world.

The Oscarettes have no helpers, no press agents — since everyone agrees it is great, rewarding and wonderful for Hollywood, but they have no time to contribute. Although as one official said, "If they were delinquents, yes." But young people who are fine good citizens like rewarding attention too. A breakfast food company approached us with an offer for ten thousand







This trip, to everyone's delight, Jack plays a violin solo, a swingy "Sweet Georgia Brown"/"Puttin' On The Ritz" medley, before bowing off with his trademark "Love In Bloom." . . . Shani Wallis, a femme star of the "Oliver" film, is a singing miracle, with a voice like a glorious instrument. I really dug her "I Can't Give You Anything But Love" and romantic "The Only Music That Makes Me Dance." Her song parody, a la an English stripper,



"The Magic Screen" is almost Cinerama in scope this edition, with a thrilling finish that brings the entire audience up to extra plaudits . . . Szony & Vera are top niche in la danse. They are the paragon of faultless body movements . . . Classic pantomiming by George Carl, with an assist from beautiful Felicia Atkins, is a neat comedy touch within the framework . . . Bob Williams' repartee with his reluctant two poodles is also another classic . . . Fred Roby and his clever ventriloquisms offer a delightful interlude . . . There has never been a more amazing juggling act in any Vegas show than The Villams. Their work with silver tenpins, plus acrobatics, is startling . . . Dancers and showgirls are paraded by the dozens—a dozen each of the nimble Tropicana Dancers, the dozen fleet Tropicana Boys, the twelve gorgeous Les Mannequins, plus the previously-mentioned Rudas troupe . . .
