




While discussing the recent fire that razed the **Day Dream Riding Stables**, we learned that none of the horses

Lights of Las Vegas

(Editor's Note: The beloved Jimmy Durante takes over for the vacationing Phil Solomon, this week. Jimmy and his crew are currently at the D.I. with Abbe Lane.)

I made my television debut 20 years ago and you know, it was more fun then. We did better shows, I think audiences liked them more and personally, I came across better. Now I know this won't apply to everyone, but for me, I'd like to see "live" shows and do away with tape for the variety programs.

I did four different live shows from 1950 to 1957 — "Four Star Revue," "All Star Revue," "Colgate Comedy Hour" and "Club Oasis." When I did the shows for Texaco, most were on film.

Our routine was simple. We began rehearsing around Tuesday, blocked the day before, did a run-through and dress rehearsal on the day of the show and then did an hour, all "live." On our show day, we always knew when we'd be finished, no waiting, nothin' — once the show began at 5 p.m. we knew we'd have to be off by 6 p.m. and that was that!

If we made a mistake, we adlibbed thru it and for my particular style, it was perfect. Audiences loved to see me forget a line, or break up a guest. But no matter how many goofs we made, we always found our way back and all the commercials got in on time.

Guests were exciting to work with then. On Mondays, my publicity man Joe Bleeden would bring over the guests and a photographer to my home in Beverly Hills and we'd shoot all kinds of people around the house. In those wonderful years we had such people as Ethel Barrymore, John Wayne, Robert Mitchum, Gloria Swanson, Bette Davis, Ezio Pinza, Peter Lawford, Carol Channing, Phil

Harris, Liberace, Jessel, Cantor, Fred Allen, Sinatra, Donald O'Connor, Melchior, Lily Pons, Carmen Miranda, Boyer, Ernie Borgnine, George Raft, Shelly Winters, I could name 50 more. All the guests used to sing and dance with me and even though it was different for most of them, when show time came, everyone was ready.

There is something special you get when you are doing a show for 30 million people "right now" and even the audiences can feel this spark. You give it to them, they give it right back to you and it's magnified.

When you have to stop a taping session because a note was wrong, or a light, or someone forgets a line, you lose a piece of your original enthusiasm. And when you've done 12 takes, it's hard to be as fresh as you were the first time. Sometimes you feel that since you'll stop tape anyway, you don't put all your effort in it. This isn't the way to perform and I think audiences can tell the difference.

If something goes wrong on a show, let it stand. I remember seeing Martin and Lewis stop a "live" show to bring out a prop man when a set collapsed

on camera. The audiences loved it. When Donald O'Connor would finish a "live" dance number, he'd get standing ovations. Abbott and Costello too would get great hands when they used a lot of special props and they all worked. Our prop guy, Al Borden, was the best - he's still at NBC.

We had inventive directors and writers then. Sometimes they had to come up with a piece of material while we were on the air. If a number was short, we added. If it was long, we cut - all while the cameras were on. And what a burden this placed on our musicians. Many times they had to take new cues while they were still playing a number. Our musical directors like Roy Bargy and Al Goodman were musical geniuses.

For me, TV was meant to be "live" and I'd like to see 'em go back to that for variety shows. If we had done our Lennon Sisters Show for ABC that way, we might still be on the air, and it would be cheaper too. When you know it's happening "now," you feel

a part of it and you wait for something to happen. When you see it on tape, you know it's almost perfect and for some performers, it ain't right.

In closing, I wanna thank Phil Solomon for giving me the opportunity to reminisce and let me express my thoughts. I hope he'll invite me back soon.

I loves ya all! Thanks folks.



OFF THE SHELF: Robert Sylvester is a remarkably nice fellow. He can be gruff and kind in the same phone call. His auditory system can hear the crying of a desperate press agent down the hall. Strike that. His ears can pick up a publicist's whimper a block way. Bald now and paunchy, Sylvester bats out many funny columns each week for the New York Daily News. In another time, he spent long nights, muted hangovers and endless promenades absorbing what was Broadway, theatrical lore, downtown life. He makes a strong case for the 30's in a book titled "notes of a guilty bystander," which Prentice-Hall was wise to publish. The whole shameless era is face up right on the pages. You're in the Stork Club one page and Grover Whalen is the Police Commissioner earlier in the book. Prize fighters are punching their way through bouts at the Garden.
