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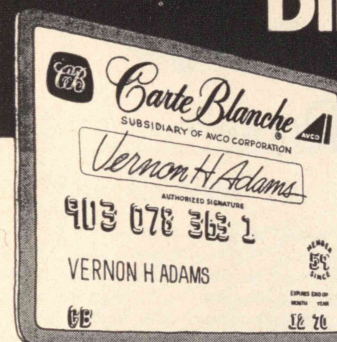
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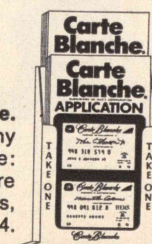

I arose and looked out the back door of our second floor apartment and saw a quiet empty street. I turned off the lights, and no sooner had I stretched out on the bed again, a frightening noise like the swoosh of an Indiana tornado was heard, the entire house (four units) trembled, the pictures fell from the walls, the cupboards flew open, breaking the glasses, dishes and the huge coffee maker. I was knocked out of bed, could hardly get my footing, and then made a dash for the front of the house. I had to go thru a long hallway, where bookcases are on one side. The books tumbled out on me, and I lifted my hands to protect my head. One hand was damaged from the full set of "Ridpath's History of the World" and ten years of "The American Funeral Director." I was bleeding from head to foot, managed to get to the front of the house and down the stairs. Everything was in a complete shambles. The entire neighborhood was on their lawns and in the street. No electricity! No gas! No water! A dark and dismal world! The electric power lines were still breaking and sputtering, our only manner of light!

Police cars patrolled the streets! Soldiers in jeeps were also evident. Our three buildings suffered about \$5,000 worth of damage, but most of all we were alive! We could have met death in those fleeting 70 seconds of the quake! Many people suffered heart attacks, but were able to recover! We were told to boil water! What water? Then the news came thru that President Nixon and Governor Reagan had declared California a "disaster area"! And then for three days and nights recurrent shocks kept

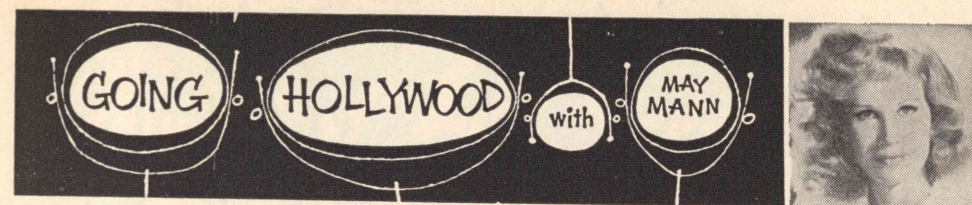

This year, in spite of his busy budding career, he wanted to go on to college. He enrolled at Palo Alto when the earthquake shook Los Angeles. Knowing his father was away on location in Arizona, the conscientious son drove back to see whether their family's Malibu house was all right. On his drive back up the Pacific Coast Highway, **Bill** was instantly killed in a car crash. He was now 24.

At the memorial were his Green Beret buddies and a full body in uniform from San Diego Army and Navy Academy. His parents flew his ashes to Catalina, where they went to sea on the wind and the waves, at **Bill's** favorite undersea diving spot. His father always kept a close-knit family. **Billy** and his sister and the wife-

Miss **Totie Fields**, the carefree, caloric comedienne who combines wit with width will bring high-fashion fun and humor to **Riviera Hotel** on Wednesday night March 3 for a three week engagement. She will be supported by singer **Tommy Leonetti**.

This will be her third appearance in the main showroom, offering two shows a night throughout the entire stand.

The hefty **Miss Fields**, who will never see a size 10 again, except on someone else, is one of the few funny females working the nitery circuit today as a headliner.

She exaggerates her weight for laughs, but along with the sight comedy she keeps her routine topical.

Most of her routines are geared to such matters as diet, beauty treatments, shopping, getting into pantyhose and similar situations. All are calculated to win ready feminine response.

Miss Fields is an outstanding ad-lib artist, quickly turning audience situations into laugh traps as if they were there for pre-written dialogue.

All of her songs blend neatly into the turn, "I'm Perfect" clicking as a put-on overlooking her trademark obesity. Her version of "Am I Blue?" while perched on a piano is a classic of distaff levity.

The extroverted delivery of appropriate comedy lines by **Miss Fields** easily win over the men in the audience also.

The popular comedienne began her professional career at age 14 as a band singer while attending high school in Hartford, Conn.

At 18 she moved to Boston to pursue a serious singing career. She used comedy sparingly then, but displayed

an inventive, agile and quick wit.

While appearing at **Frolics Club** in Boston, the rotund comedienne met **George Johnston**, a tall frail comic, who was on the same bill.

Johnston recognized her natural ability as a comedienne. They fell in love and their romance led to marriage and a new direction for her career-comedy.

Not very long after **Johnston** gave up his career as a comic and joined her as musical director.

Miss Fields struck it rich the past few years and is considered among the ten top female comedy stars of this era.

He never won an Oscar, but one thing you could count on was action and plenty of it. We won't see his kind ever again. On to next week's trivia question: On the radio show "Mr. District Attorney," name the actors who played "Mr. D. A., Harrington and Miss Miller." A toughie but a goodie.

We soon discovered that the Morgan sound would be carried on by Russ' son, Jack Morgan. Jack was a sideman in his dad's band and, like his father, played trombone. Jack is warm, handsome, tactful and a good showman. And loyal. He is the only bandleader who takes his original band with him when touring. Others like Orrin Tucker, Vaughn Monroe, Charlie Barnet, and Gene Krupa pick

up local men when they appear, although Gene Krupa is forbidden by his doctor to ever perform again, due to a respiratory ailment. Comforting to know that there is a traveling band that works out of Las Vegas. Now, remember, I'm talking about bands from our town, not the bands of Duke Ellington, Woody Herman, etc. Their business is still one night stands to two or four weeks at one spot.

Speaking about the Russ Morgan band, trumpet player Jimmy Campbell out of action due to ailing fingers. His presence will be missed. Jimmy was with the Harry James and Charlie Barnet bands in the era of the Big Bands. So — drop by the Dunes and dance . . . and remember. That's what it's all about, today.

Some geographically-minded friend writes "whaddaya mean — Brooklyn (N.Y. — where else?)." He reminds there is a Brooklyn, Wisconsin (yeah! but there's only one true Brooklyn — the one with the Brooklynese accent!). This map reader wants to know if our readers know of any other Brooklyns. He winds up his sage commentary with a Bronx approach — "The tree that grows in Brooklyn was once a Flatbush!"

That's almost as bad as the Beverly Hills dentist Harold Ravins who is calling his memoirs — "To Tell The Tooth." (Ouch!)

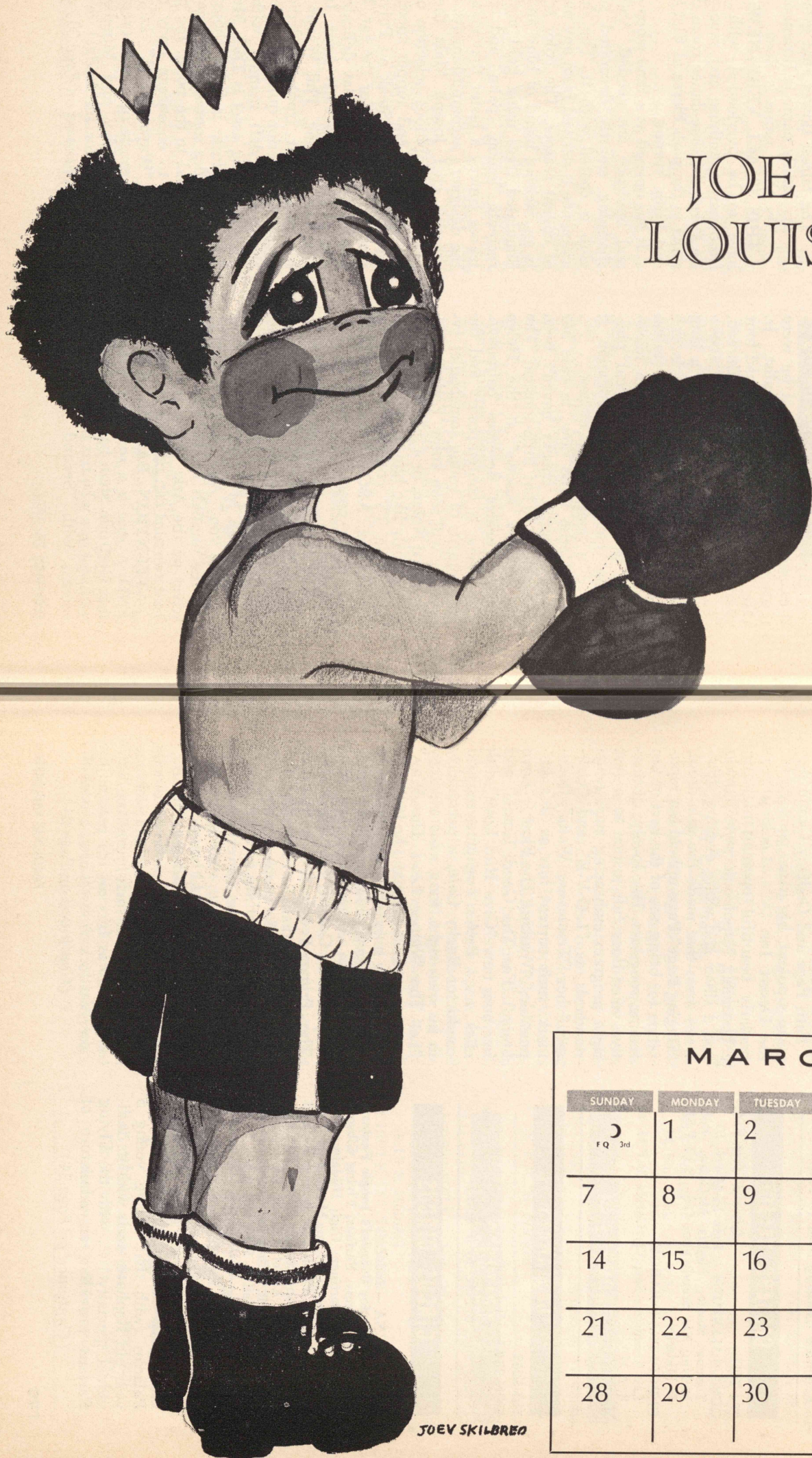

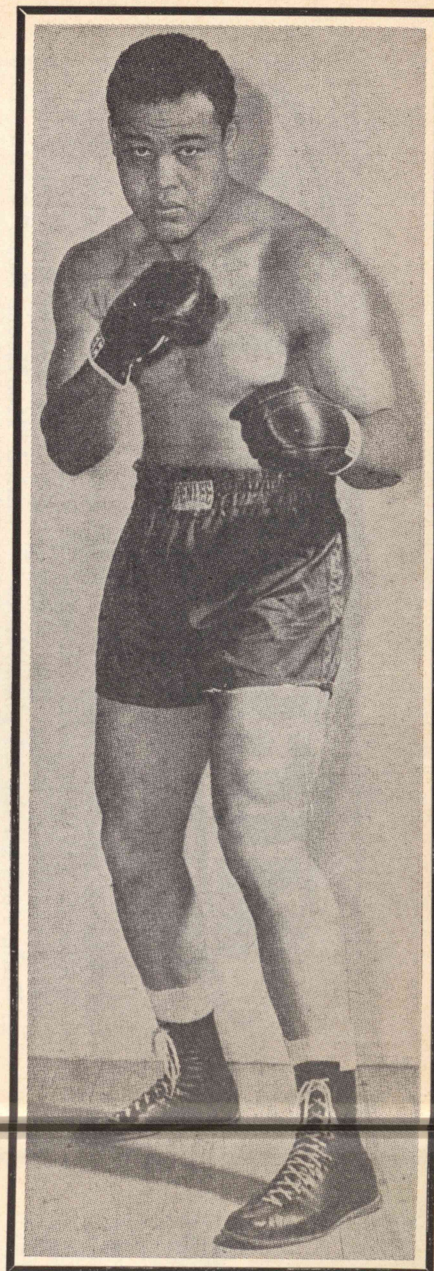

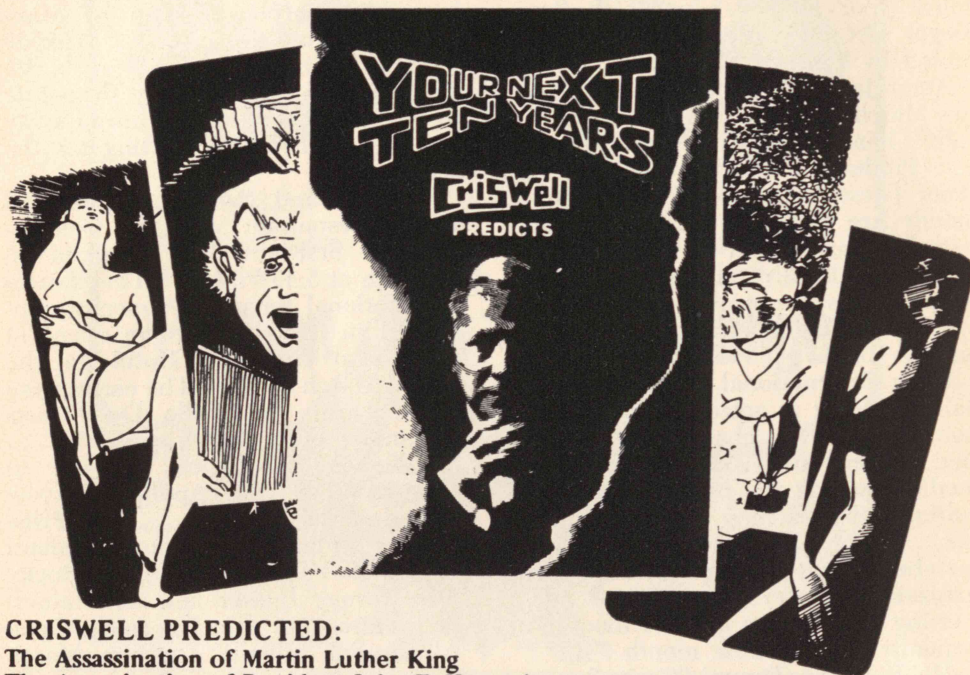
