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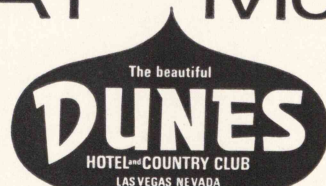
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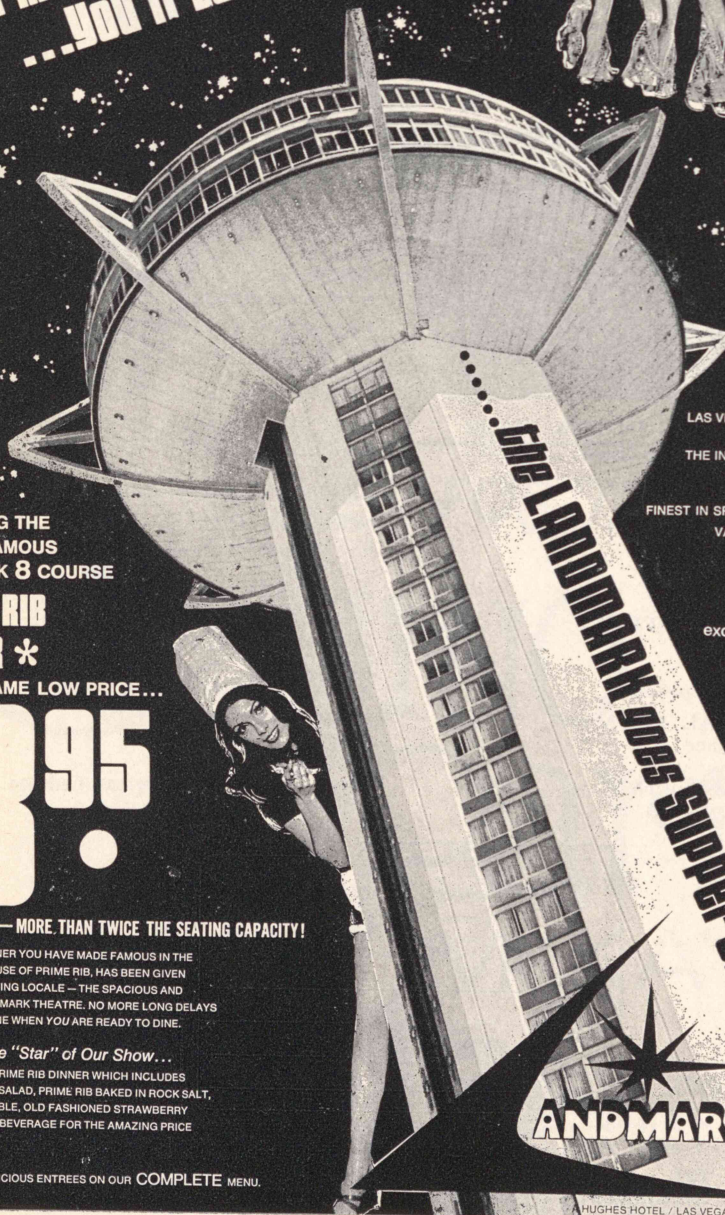

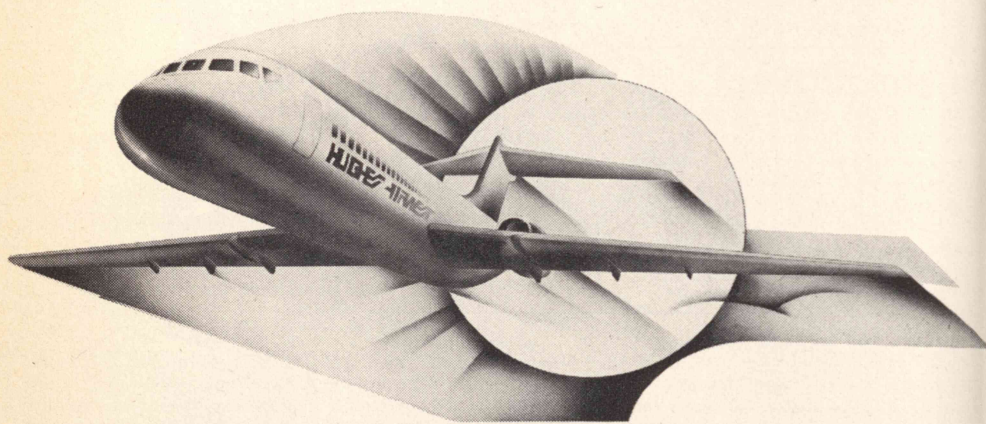

ENJOYED another talk session with Harry Mills in the Flamingo coffee shop and learned that the Mills Brothers will topline the main show-room with Myron Cohen, November 23 . . . The Mills have also signed a star pact to play New York's Palace — date not confirmed. On the bill with them will be Helen O'Connell and Woody Herman (who hasn't played the Palace since 1930).

The Mills Freres first appeared at the Palace in 1929. They topline the bill, supported by Beatrice Lillie and Fifi D'Orsay. On the same show, doing a small bit with Fifi was a chap who went on to become "Mr. Television," the current D.I. comedy star Milton Berle.

During the course of our conversation, we speculated on performers who would draw the public . . . performers now ruled out because they don't have the "marquee value" so important to entertainment chiefs these days . . . but performers who are undeniably entertaining. Some of the names that drew applause from our table were — Romo Vincent, Zero Mostel, Nellie Lutcher and Radcliffe & Rogers. Harry explained the latter team were originators of the type of material that Redd Foxx and Slappy White are doing.

The chap who stands in the background beaming is Billy's dad Tino (manager of Frank Sinatra, Jr.). The fellow next to Tino, beaming just as broadly, is Richie Lisella, Tino's assistant.

Last week's reference to the Aladdin sale was strictly an "oh no, not again" item intent. However . . . The Riviera is listening to an offer from

a Florida-based source that unsuccessfully sought to purchase another Strip hotel, not too long ago. Whether or not a transaction will be consummated is anyone's guess. We know the bidders and know they are serious — but who will speak for the Riviera?

You can bet Mac Davis will sing "Baby, Don't Get Hooked On Me" when he appears on the Merv Griffin TVviewer on the 31st. The single has been on the top charts for 17 weeks, with the album #16, last week.

Barry Ashton's Silver Slipper Burlesquer closes on April 1st ('73). Current plans then call for a conversion of the Gaiety Theatre to a lounge area, following the show precedent set by the Landmark. It will be the second Hughes showroom to make the transition.

The Landmark may dispute that "lounge" reference for they now call the converted showroom their Supper Club Theatre. The Prime Rib (moved in from the 27th floor) will be on the menu, with food served throughout the nightly entertainment period. Patrons will be guaranteed a complete show, no matter when they arrive (just like the movies) . . . The Supper Club will be showcasing "new

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to Las Vegas" talents, according to Hotel Director **Bob Case**.

Gone may be our notes — but not the memory of a lovely evening at the **Harvey Silbert** Testimonial Dinner — **Riviera Hotel** . . . to raise funds for a Children's Wing bearing **Harvey's** name, at **Sinai-Cedars Hospital**. An attorney in Beverly Hills and co-owner of the **Riviera**, **Harvey** was admirably self-effacing about the honor. As we congratulated him, he hugged and kissed this publisher and humbly thanked us for being present . . . An audience standout was the beautiful **Grace Hayes**.

From Hawaii, **Takeuchi Keigo** memos that all options of his "**Geisha'Rella**" show have been picked up by the **Kuilima Hotel**, through Dec. 3. Then, back to Ellay to rehearse for their return to the **Thunderbird** . . . Wonder if the new owners of the **Bird** will make immediate entertainment policy changes?

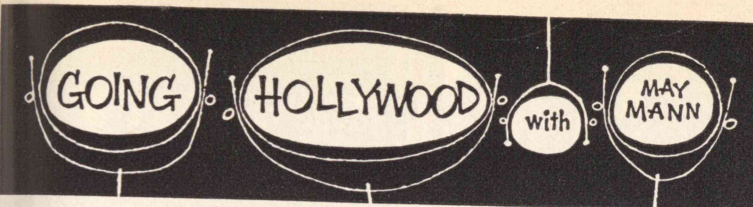
That dark-eyed beauty you saw on the arm of **Flamingo** headliner **Sergio Franchi** was his sister **Dana Valery**.

## HALSTON AT MAGNIN'S

"You are only as good as the people you dress" . . . With total calm and an elegant reserve, fashion designer **Halston** appeared at **Joseph Magnin's** with his resort collection. The materials used in his garments are as caressingly soft to the touch as a baby's first kiss.

There is nothing apparently overwhelming about **Roy Halston Frowick**. Although acknowledged as "the hottest American designer of the moment" by **James Brady**, publisher of **Harper's Bazaar**, one couldn't detect any snobbery in his make up. Perhaps it was the atmosphere of **Magnin's**, where showgirl and Mrs. Millionaire seek fashion assistance, in proximal unison.

The designer is a very youthful forty and has been designing for twenty years. His first creation was an Easter bonnet for his mother, when he was 13 years old. **Halston** entered a major phase of his career when he designed and managed the hat division for **Lily Dache** in 1957. A year later, his own labels were featured in **Bergdorf Goodman's** custom millinery. He won the **Coty Award** for millinery in 1962. Four years later, his designs were centered in the first boutique **Bergdorf's** introduced. At the end of 1968, **Halston Limited** was formed.

The innovative designer has a three story boutique in New York, with prices rising to meet each level. The "Who's Who" of society and the entertainment field are devotees of his custom wear.

The **Halston** collection stresses simplicity and practicality, sans fad. Street lengths hover about the knee, no minis. The revival of cashmere

is predominant, along with "ultra-suede," a synthetic, non-leather that can be tossed into the washing machine. He uses georgette, gabardine, silk, chiffon, linen, matte jersey and wool.

An advocate of pantsuits, **Halston** designs suits with both a skirt and pants. His clothes are completely devoid of frou-frou discomfort. A two piece evening dress has a long bias skirt and bare halter top that ties around the waist. Short, clinging evening dresses are turned out in matte jersey. An unlined matte jersey cape coat falls straight and full from the shoulders, without fastening. This coat was originally designed for **Liza Minnelli** and it has found favor with **Miss** and **Mrs. America**.

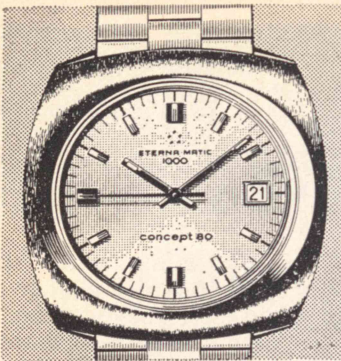
**Liza** has 22 different hues of one **Halston** design, the decollete jersey she usually wears for her first on-stage cue.

One could reach into the field of music to describe the **Halston** collection . . . beautiful standards. The lack of faddism precludes their becoming tiresome. The ease of wearability is as comforting as a favorite love song.

There are also non-sophisticated numbers like **Halston's** caftan in tie-dye. This was modeled by **Pat Ast**, one of the stars of **Andy Warhol's** movie, "**Heat**." In the group of tall, lithe models, the heavyset **Miss Ast** looked as incongruous as a dumpling in a bowl of caviar. However, **Halston** believes there is a definite place for the caftan in the fashion world and intends to continue its inclusion in his line.

The collection shown at **Joseph Magnin's** ranged from \$80 for a two piece cashmere sweater/pants combine to a \$650 double-faced wool coat.





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Elsa Peretti designs the jewelry used to accent the Halston designs. She is an Italian model who won the Coty Award in 1971. One of her pieces was a long silver chain slung over a model's shoulder, attached to a petite box, identified as an evening purse. It wasn't large enough to hold much more than a lipstick and a set of keys.

If you've been bemoaning the fact that you can't find the "New York look of casual elegance," wipe your tears and head for Joseph Magnin's on the Strip. There is one knit outfit that any transplanted New Yorker would treasure ... a long beige dress with a butterscotch coat.

One doesn't have to be a Jackie Onassis or a Mrs. Bill Paley or a Doris Duke to wear a Halston creation. All one has to do is visit Magnin's, where store manager Kay Fish will assign you a charming wardrobe warden to assist you in your Halston quest.

An all-out effort is being made by Kirk Kerkorian to bring Frank Sinatra out of retirement to open MGM's Grand Hotel in Dec. '73. Since the opening is some time off, the thin singer may change his mind which many doubt.

Sinatra vowed that he would never play the Entertainment Capital of the world after the DA and Sheriff's office gave him a bad time in the two incidents at the Sands and Caesars Palace. In the latter beef, the law enforcement made Sinatra the bad guy after Sandy Waterman pulled a gun on the singer.

Should Sinatra turn down Kerkorian's offer Elvis Presley will become the number one star as swivel hips makes his movies at MGM, Saw Col.

Tom Parker at Del Webb's Kuilima Hotel in Hawaii and he wouldn't admit nor deny the signing of his star with Grand Hotel. (The Colonel has since issued a denial.)

Understand that Kerkorian is prepared to pay Presley as much as \$200,000 a week and we can't see any manager or entertainer turning down that kind of money. The new complex would like to ink Elvis for a three year stint with more options. They may even give the star some stock, gratis. It all depends how badly Elvis is wanted.

There's some talk of Presley appearing at Las Vegas Hilton for a four week engagement sometime toward the end of January. The hotel doesn't have him signed at this writing.
