




ers. As a matter of fact, the **Sahara** is fortunate that she didn't shanghai the show to England!

A new industry invades the Entertainment Capital of the world very shortly creating many new jobs in the television field. Trans-American Video exec. V.P. **Bud Murphy** visualizes this city as a new production center for live and taped TV shows.

TAV has purchased some very expensive equipment to meet the demands of any show. They will operate nine mobile units ranging from one to six cameras depending on the size of the production.

Murphy believes this city will become another Hollywood or New York for television production. He predicts a bright future here as many of the hotels are gearing themselves for videotape shows.

In the past few months **TAV** has been bringing crews from Hollywood and filling in with local members of IATSE who have been in training for programming. Full time personnel will go on the payroll by May. More people will be needed as more shows are filmed here.

Last year **Merv Griffin** decided to put some of his shows on tape from here and **TAV** got involved. As a team they worked out the problems and in one week were ready to shoot anything in sight with no hangups. Word got out that **TAV** was prepared to meet all requirements.

Many of the hotels are sharing some of the TV production expenses. They realize the publicity derived from exposure around the country.

Maury Stevens, a very capable local promotion exec has joined **TAV**. He has entered into every hotel and is friendly with all union reps. Anything he undertakes is usually a success. A better contact couldn't have been chosen for the position and a wise choice by the TV company.

Mobile units will continue to be

housed in Hollywood by **TAV** and on short notice can be dispatched. Reasonable rental fees have been set without mileage charges to the packagers and producers. The units can be driven anywhere in southern Nevada in a matter of hours.

TAV was contracted to send their cameras to southern part of the state for 26 weeks taping of "Jerry Vale's World," a new 30 minute syndicated series for **Reina Productions**.


This could be a very lucrative new business in the next couple of years.
