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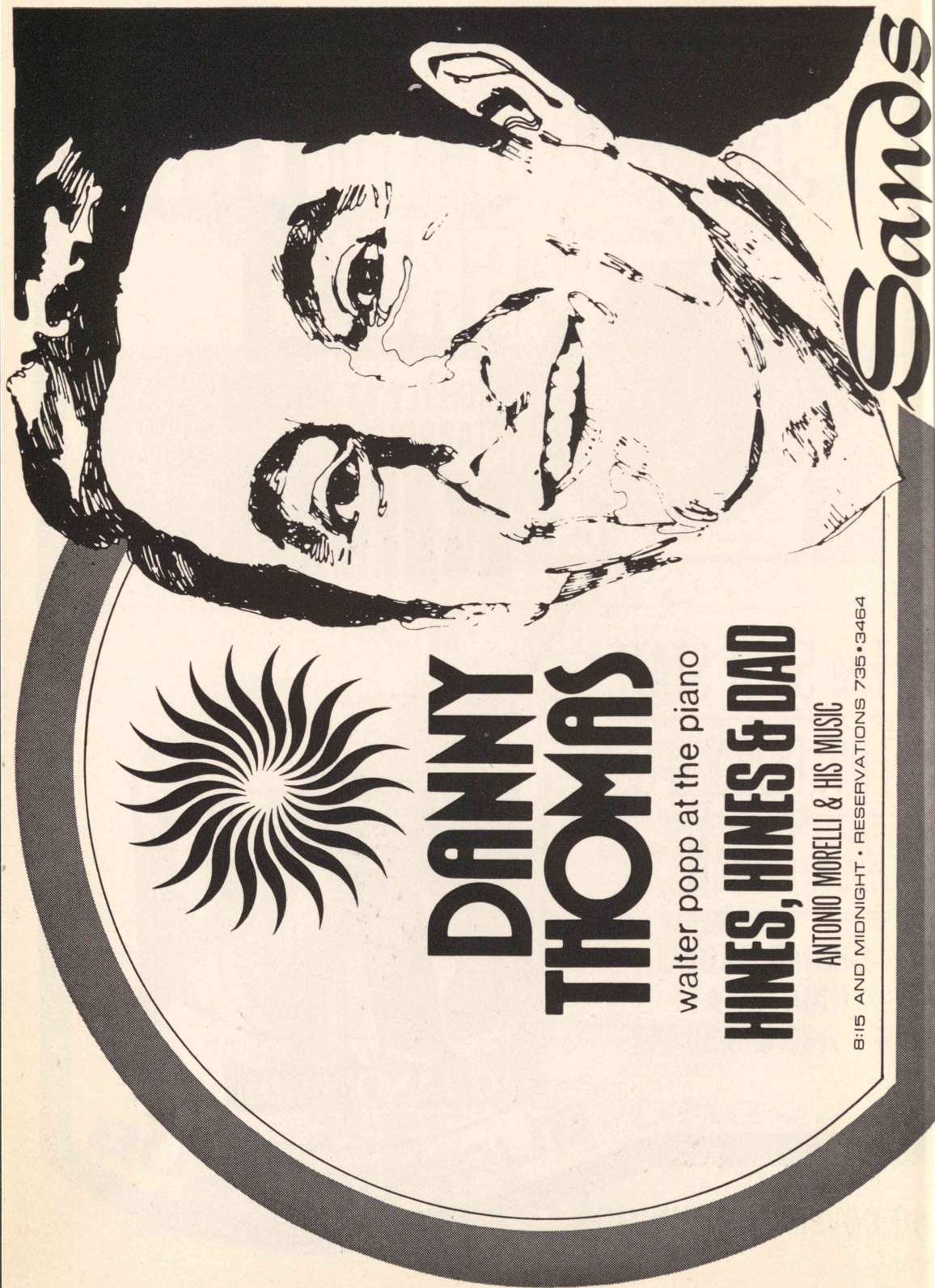

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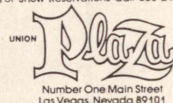

Even though Mary Retting was reviewing the opening, it was impossible for this publisher to avoid slipping into the room to enjoy watching Donald's return to show biz. His talents warmed up the room like a million dollar shower. Unforgettable is his challenge tap dancing with the 3rd Generation Steps.

Discussing Donald's opening with Walter Kane, Mr. K. reminisced about booking the O'Connor Family as an act, some years back . . . Lights of Las Vegas

Double-barreled entertainment with boxoffice appeal will be the big offering at Riviera Hotel beginning on Wed. April 25 as Shecky Greene and Academy Award winner Joel Grey open a short two week engagement.

The two G's, Greene and Grey are top-rated headliners individually and together. Their brief stint should be SRO for the entire stand. Maitre d' Rudy Guerrero reports a heavy advance reservation.

Greene began his comedy career by winning an amateur contest with the prize being a two week club date. The gifted comedian never looked back and has been a professional entertainer since.

Unlike many other comics, Greene uses no writers and considers himself an "improvisational comic." He is amused by younger comedians who believe they coined the term "improvisational." He says, "When you do four shows a night in and around Chicago, you have to improvise. No comedian can come up with that much material except on the fly."

Story-telling becomes all the more vivid when enhanced by Greene's talent with various dialects. He also spices up his act with songs.

Grey acclaimed for his role in "Cabaret," is beginning to enjoy nightclub entertaining. "I know now what I want from life. Where I'm going and how to face people."

He says he did a single act years ago but didn't enjoy it: "It was a traumatic experience." He's getting over that feeling. "I found that I no longer have to hide behind the role I'm playing, I can go out on stage being myself and it isn't too bad."

Show business is not new to Joel, his father, the famous singing Jewish comedian Mickey Katz still per-

forms occasionally. The youngster began acting at the age of ten when he debuted as Pud in "On Borrowed Time." When he was 19 he appeared in New York's Copacabana.

Because of a lonely, disillusioned life of traveling, Grey gave up nightclubs entirely and returned to the theatre.

In 1967 his "Cabaret" performance on Broadway won Grey the Tony as "Best Supporting Actor," the Outer Circle Critics Award and the Variety Critics Award. Two years later he followed his "Cabaret" success by starring in "George M." His portrayal of the song and dance man won him Variety Critics Award as Best Actor and his second Tony nomination.

Joel Grey's future never looked brighter and deserving of every break he gets in show business. His mother Grace and father Mickey should be real proud of this fine youngster who struggled to make the grade.

EAT TREAT BEAT: **Rosoff's**, off Times Square, has an ideal location, **FABULOUS** food and sensible prices. "**The Odd Couple**" in **Filet Mignon** and **Lobster Tail**. . . Up in **Yorkville**, **Kleine Konditorei** is a fine restaurant, born out of a pastry shop. Craving for **Sauerbraten** with **Dumplings** and **Red Cabbage** will be more than satisfied.

FROM F 2 - 4: "**Seesaw**" is a plain musical, stripped of gaudery, relying heavily on a good ¾ comedy - ¼ drama straight play "**Two For The Seesaw**" out of the brain of **William Gibson**. At the new **Uris Theatre**, a lower floor showcase in an office building (rest easy J.J., Lee and Sam), it makes its points without too much in the way of songs from the extremely able **Dorothy Fields** and the competent **Cy Coleman**. The production numbers move and the acting on the part of the leads is far better than the histrionics usually associated with a boy and girl as the love interests in a live tuner. **Michele Lee** is Gittel, all right. Lithe, Jewish, dark, leggy, rhythmic and a solid singer. **Ken Howard**, blond, waspish, indecisive, more married than he shows,

carries off his Nebraskan in New York character with a relaxed posture. He is agile and acceptable as a dancer — for a short spell. Truth is, he can't sing. But he doesn't have what to sing. Aside from **Ms. Lee's** stand-out performance anent her first entrance to her last exit, a lean tree of a guy, **Tommy Tune** comes near stopping the performance with a semi-eccentric, rubbery dance routine. Also young **Giancarlo Esposito** gets strong reaction as the adolescent who vents his pipes in a lesson in composite language, "**Spanglish**." Certain musical segments aren't integrated easily into the book, but the audience, having a very good time, cares little for structure. "**Seesaw**" isn't a smash, but **Michele Lee** is. So how about calling it — "**Leesaw**."

OFF THE SHELF: "**Theatre World**," Volume 28, a legacy that **John Willis** inherited from the late **Daniel Blum**, is out again thanks to **Crown Publishers, Inc.** It covers what event the stage offered in the '71-'72 season. Every cast change is neatly recorded, so is the history of the show — opening, closing, theatre, etc. Pictures by the hundreds. What devoted buff, goer or reviewer dedicated to what transpired behind the footlights a year or so ago can deny a place on his shelf to this all encompassing annual.

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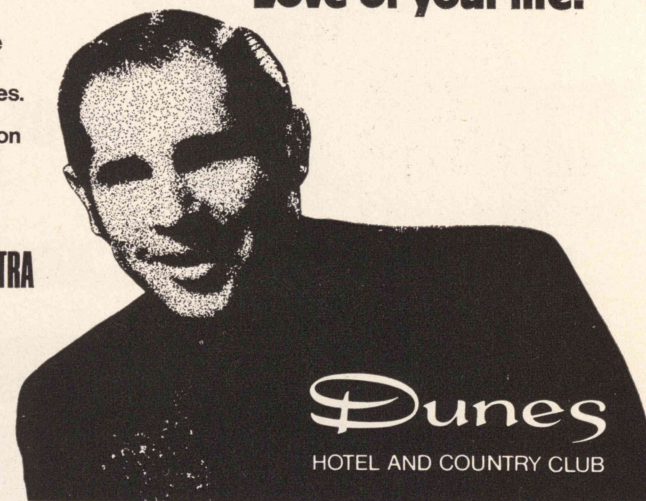
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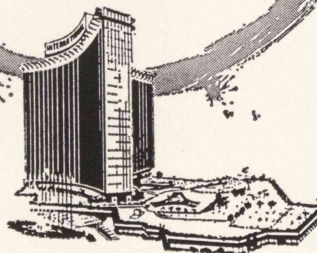
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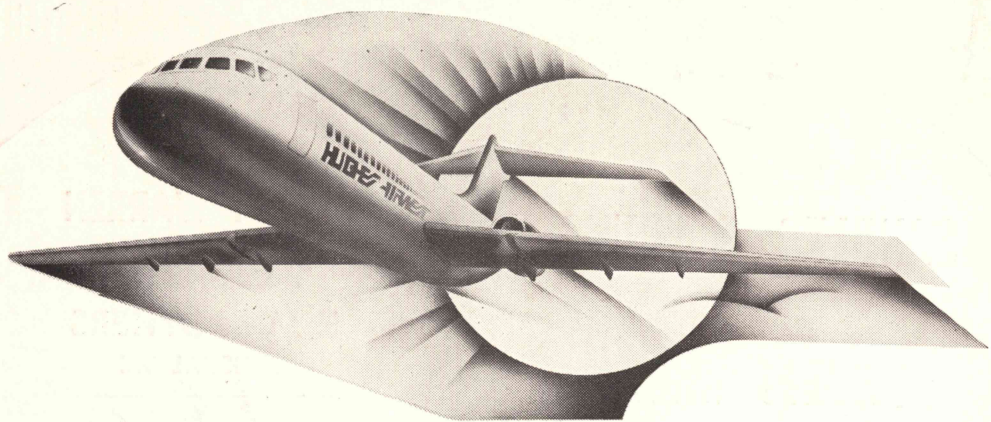
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
