

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

### ROCKING CHAIR GOSSIP




When he mentioned it to Totie Fields, she insisted Jan hold the Seder at her home this year, which he did, with a dozen of his own relatives in attendance.



# Lights of Las Vegas

The undisputed king of late-night television talk show hosts, Johnny Carson makes his first of three scheduled appearances at Del Webb's Hotel Sahara starting tonight for an eight day engagement.

Supporting Carson during this stand will be Phyllis McGuire, one of the talented singing stars of the famous McGuire Sisters. She has appeared with Carson on numerous occasions during his nightclub and concert tours.

Nightly exposure on coast-to-coast television as host of NBC's **"Tonight Show"** hasn't hurt the talented comedian as evidenced by his phenomenal draw at the gate. His concerts are all virtual sell-outs and his appearances here are no exception. This will be the start of his eighth year at Hotel Sahara and the Carson magic is just as powerful today as it was in 1966.

During my visit to New York City in 1966 this pillar had a long talk with Carson prior to his nightly TV show. He said, "I am ready to play Las Vegas anytime you set a date." When returning here I spoke to a number of entertainment Directors and they laughed as if I were crazy. Stan Irwin was the only one that saw a new star with audience appeal and signed Carson immediately.

Carson is no flash in the pan. He keeps his material topical, blending the fresh jokes with some of his established classics which include a visit to the Mayo Clinic and observations on this city as well as a funny bit on his date as a 17 year old with the town's "bad girl."

Miss McGuire has a good voice and her presentation is outstanding. She is considered a very talented singer in the trade. In this outing,

she'll show her ability as a fine impressionist doing takeoffs on known personalities like Peggy Lee, Judy Garland, Ethel Merman and Pearl Bailey to the tune of "My Way."

Am very confident that Frank Sinatra will come out of retirement soon. First he'll do a TV special, a number of concerts plus a few albums. Nightclubs will come later even though he was offered \$500,000 a week to open the Grand Hotel in October.

Sinatra was hurt by some of the treatment he received in this town. He, more than any other entertainer helped build this city to what it is today.

Caesars Palace has Sinatra under contract and if he tries to play any other hotel they plan to take action.

**WHEELIN' N DEALIN'** — Should Perry Como decide on a comeback with CBS TV he plans to drop his Las Vegas Hilton dates. His sidekick would be Joey Heatherton . . . There's usually a limit to a person's talents, but obviously a little beauty by the name of Judy Bell isn't buying that standard. At the Frontier's Winners Circle, this gal turns loose both barrels of her double-dealing image. She looks sweet and innocent, but does a mighty convincing sell as a sophisticated flirt.

If Judy ever decides to use ol' Cap'n Bob as a foil for one of her close-up audience grabs, somebody better have an ice tub that I can jump into — imm-med-e-gitly. She's just too much chick in that put-on of hers. It's hard enuf on a guy just to watch her at a distance, onstage. When a fella is very susceptible to beauty, a public clinch would wipe him out.

As long as everyone is laughing during that bit, a guy could suddenly choke on his cigarette smoke, to explain the red face. A non-smoker could say it was a sudden sunburn from Judy's spotlight! 

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
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
