There we were driving along the freeway being complimented by New York friends for our good safe driving, and feeling very pleased and all — when at that exact moment in the dark of the night, comes a flashing red light of a car behind us. Since it had never happened to us before, we decided someone wanted to warn us of danger ahead or something, so we casually pulled up to a safety zone. Lights of Las Vegas

Entertainers playing in Nevada are the best paid. There isn't a single place in the world that can match the salary of Las Vegas, Reno or Lake Tahoe.

Salaries of good entertainers with box office appeal are on the rise and most of them reaching superstar status are asking as much as \$100,000 a week.

Some of the main showroom salaries begin at \$25,000 a week and go upward. In order to pay the big salary a showroom must sell out every show. Competition is getting keen each year with the opening of new hotels. Every operator claims that showrooms are a losing proposition.

One night concerts where a star gets \$25,000 for each appearance are hurting in Nevada. There is no ceiling on salaries for stars. The entertainment director must buy as reasonably as he can and now it's a matter of supply and demand as there are only so many superstars.

When a new hotel is built it must be competitive and in most cases have to pay more money to get the star it wants. This raises the salary and before you know it the price is out of reach. The entertainers who can fill a showroom every performance are not plentiful.

Many entertainers have requirements that are very costly in addition to salary, like extra musicians plus many extras and the hotel booking the star must pay for the pluses or lose their services.

Some lounge acts had priced themselves out of the picture by asking exorbitant salaries. Hotels want to break even. Low priced mini revues may be the answer eventually for the lounges in operation.

If salaries for talent keep rising

many of the major hotels will resort to extravaganzas with no name stars. A maximum and minimum salary for all performers should be set. This would give each hotel an equal chance to obtain the entertainers they want.

WHEELIN' N DEALIN' — Comedienne - ventriloquist Kay Carole, who opens a two week stand in Hotel Sahara lounge on May 28 will remind you of Don Rickles and Jack E. Leonard in her hilarious insult routines . . . Burl Ives' only nightclub date this year will be for his friend John Ascuaga at Sparks Nugget in Aug. . . . An informed source says Mae West received many offers to repeat her Los Angeles Masquers act here and is undecided whether to accept one of them . . . Wayne Newton may have to bow out of one stand at Sands Hotel if he gets the CBS TV series . . . Bob Newhart had to cancel his four week Desert Inn stand slated for a May 29 opening. Milton Berle will sub with co-headliner Florence Henderson.

Due to a new television pact, Sammy Davis will not open Tropicana's new Superstar Theatre in Aug. Alan Lee is working on another big name

ADDENDA: At the third evening of "A Saturday Night With a Filmmaker," housed at the 92nd St. YM-YWHA, there was an articulate, humorous **Peter Bogdanovich** explaining phases of "The Last Picture Show," teasing the audience with clips of "Paper Moon" (his latest, which looks like a smash) and excerpts from the goofs of **Babs Streisand** and **Ryan O'Neal**. . . . **King Chuan** is worthy of a recommendation. This good, unpretentious Chinese restaurant features **Sauteed Shrimp with Chili Sauce** . . . At the **Rainbow Grill**, **Julie Wilson** showed how "Mean to Me" and "The One I Love Belongs To Somebody Else" should be sung. The special material by **Eli Basse** in other moments stood out. And anybody who has **Milton Hinton** on bass is our kind of girl singer. He smiles better than most bassists pluck.


