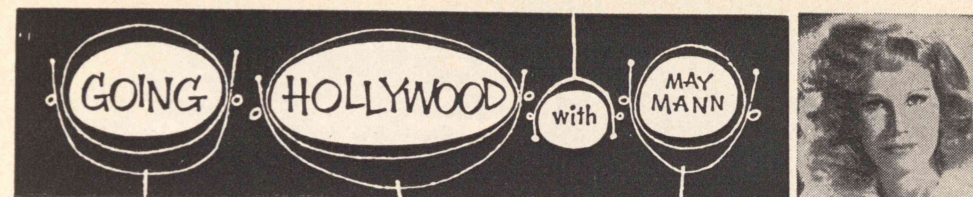

Pepi and Herbert Luft, back from a long sojourn in London and the continent film-making, gathered some interesting people in the film business, as they always do at their house: just to celebrate being home. Herbert is Associate Executive Producer of the Getty Picture Corporation. Even with the Getty money, which means the best, you can be very glad to be home, even though life on the Thames at the Dorchester, London is smashing, isn't it.

A real German dinner, cooked by Pepi herself, and served by their butler, who looks as though he's in a movie playing the role, with such aplomb, had everyone going back for seconds.

J. Ronald Getty, Prez of the Getty Picture Corp. (as well as Getty Laboratories, Chairman of the Board and majority stockholder of Don the Beachcomber chain, and of Getty Financial Corp. with vast oil interest in Kansas, aside from Getty Oil International—there I really sleuthed didn't I) said he was leaving next a.m. to visit the various branches of Getty Oil throughout the world. Lights of Las Vegas

LAS VEGAS—Unprecedented prosperity has hit the Entertainment Capital of the world with an estimated \$250 million in additions or expansions for most of the resort hotels.

Motivated by a period of capacity business during the Winter months, construction plans at a dozen places call for 10,000 additional guest rooms, expected to create employment for about 4,000 persons in the next year.

Usually hotel operators worry during the Winter season on how to get business to fill the rooms. This past season the problem was what to do with the business on hand. Each year business keeps getting bigger and better.

Ground is expected to be broken soon for the twin 22 story towers adding 1,000 rooms to the Tropicana Hotel. The towers are part of \$35 million expansion program to include Tropicadome, a 3,000 person convention facility, the 1,000 seat Superstar Theatre due to be completed before Sept. and the most beautiful indoor tennis courts ever seen.

Tropicana is one of the smallest hotels on the Strip with only 545 rooms. With the new addition, it will give them over 1500 rooms and suites.

Work is underway on the \$14 million, 600 room addition to the Hilton Hotel and completion is slated for Spring 1974 bringing the hotel's room total to 2,119. A couple of new restaurants will be added.

Construction on the \$83 million Grand Hotel, the biggest resort hotel in the world, is far ahead of schedule and is expected to open in Oct. The 2100 room complex wasn't due for completion until early next year.

Hacienda Hotel will have a new facade and is planning a 15,000 foot casino addition and its Travel World

expansion on 27 acres in October. Their proposed hi-rise will add 1000 rooms to their current count of 650.

Thunderbird, recently purchased by Caesars World from Del Webb plan to rename it Marc Anthony. They will build 40 story towers containing 2500 guest rooms costing over \$50 million.

Caesars Palace has contracted Del Webb to build a 333 room 16 story addition at a cost of \$8.3 million bringing the total number of rooms to 1,238.

The Flamingo just completed a \$5 million remodeling job and is planning to break ground for a high-rise tower adding 250 rooms to be ready in '74.

Aladdin Hotel plans on adding 528 rooms in a 21 story structure if financing can be arranged. This would double their present 335 rooms capacity and is part of a \$40 million master plan. They hope to start in the Fall.

Dunes has 500 rooms and 80 suites on the drawing board in a tentative \$10 million expansion with five new restaurants and a new theatre restaurant plus an intimate steak house.

Circus Circus is seeking funds for a 15 story complex housing 400 more rooms to cost \$6 million. Construction could begin anytime and completed in '74.

Showboat has just about completed the \$4 million nine story building of 150 guest rooms and 1,000 person convention hall.

Mint Hotel is working on \$2 million, six story garage providing parking for 1,000 cars.

Union Plaza is talking about a 500 room expansion to start next Spring. Negotiations have been underway to purchase adjoining land north of the hotel to house 21 to 25 story structure.

Put them all together and the future looks bright than ever.

It looks as though Barron Hilton and Henri Lewin will pass on a replacement for resigned entertainment director Bill Miller at Flamingo Hotel. Las Vegas Hilton talent boss Dave Victorson will book both complexes . . . Bernie Allen and Steve Rossi have been inked for 20 additional weeks by Arvid Nelson at Hotel Sahara . . . As a result of numerous requests from patrons, Bill Harrah instituted nonsmoking sections in its Reno and Lake Tahoe theatre restaurants . . . My keyhole peeker says Johnny Carson and Buddy Hackett were discussing offers from Caesars Palace during the Emmy Awards in L.A.

Tropicana Hotel entertainment director Alan Lee is working day and night trying to sign various stars for his new showroom . . . Barbara McNair was cleared of all charges on a

MIGHTY MIXTURE

DATELINE: New York:

STAN'S STAND: Stanley Kramer, the producer-director of courageous movies, his latest being "Oklahoma Crude," was the filmmaker in focus at the 92nd St. YM-YWHA, guided gently by the host, **Richard Brown**. Said Kramer: "Jonathan Winters is one of the true geniuses I've ever met. . . . I have no favorite film. I have moments. . . . **Marlon Brando** was the greatest young actor I've ever seen."

SCRIBBLINGS: Tasty jazz is the best way to describe **Marian** and **Jimmy McPartland's** efforts at the **Royal Box**. She's a queen at the piano, he still blows a lot of trumpet. What nice things they do to "I Surrender Dear." . . . We liked the revival of "The Play's The Thing" at the **Bijou**. After all these years, **Molnar** still is a standout playwright. A line that lingers — "When a prima donna is happy she sings on key — occasionally." . . . If you're on a high floor and have something to talk about with **Ray Robinson**, perhaps the best prize fighter of the last thirty years, don't expect him up. He fears heights. Make the confab on a bench in the park. . . . While on the subject of acrophobia, **Benny Goodman** and sextet were well worth the trip to floor 65 of the **RCA Building**. The king of the clarinet and such stalwarts as **Urbie Green** and **Bobby Rosengarden** made the solidly constructed **Rainbow Grill** jump. . . . Still communing with clouds, this comment from **Rusty Staub**, of the **N.Y. Mets**: "I hate flying. I never feel comfortable in a big bird."

THE MASTER OF MOVIE MOOD MUSIC: Maybe they apothecize **Max Steiner** on old Hollywood sound stages and maybe they don't.

Surely, he was a prolific man who was able to call on certain romantic themes for an assignment. More times than not they worked. **RCA Records** continuing to put out film scorings has collected a good hunk of the **Steiner** library and got **Charles Gerhardt** to conduct almost 100 musicians for an album. There are appropriate notes inside to explain what the individual pictures were all about, lest you forgot. "King Kong" is covered, so is "Johnny Belinda." "The Big Sleep" has an interesting melody woven in and "Saratoga Trunk" contributes a well written ballad. The career gestalt of **Steiner** gets more than passing tribute on both sides. The album is called "Now, Voyager," which means the haunting tune "Wrong" is heard and if you care to conjure up any particular memories of **Bette Davis** while the cut spins, go right ahead and do so. You can have your own Late Show without touching the television set.

If we can laugh at ourselves all is not lost. The writers, **Hoffman** and **Gasman** have acceptable irreverence and sardonic bite in their songs.

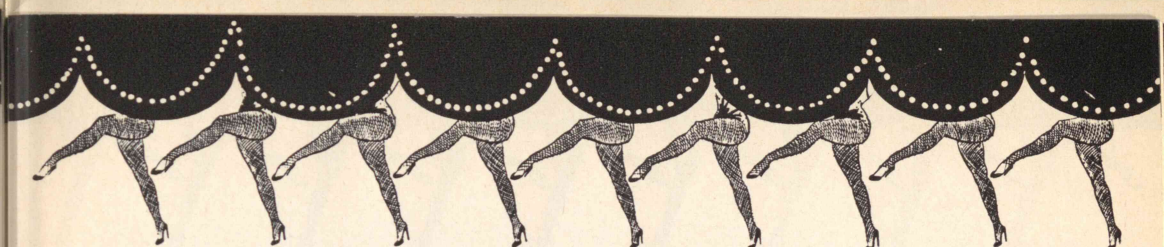
