





Lights of Las Vegas

Syndicated columnist Earl Wilson, a show biz authority is in accordance with this pillar regarding the stars pricing themselves out of business. In order to pay high salaries a showroom has to be filled for each performance and John Q. Public can't afford the asking price for the show.

Somewhere along the line there has to be a stop on all of the big offers. For the past five years we have written story after story attacking the stars and no one came to our rescue except Wilson recently.

Most of the performers are not greedy, it's the agent, manager, lawyer or accountant urging the star on to ask for more money.

In a recent column Wilson says, "It's not just the money, it's a matter of prestige — You're just as big as he is!" they'll say, badgering their star on to make bigger demands from the club owner or hotel operator.

Salaries just keep climbing, so do the cover charges, minimum charges and the average show going public can't pay the asking price. By the time a couple pays for a night's lodging, breakfast, lunch and the two shows it costs over \$100 a day here.

All the night clubs around the country are complaining and one by one they're folding, which is bad for the Entertainment Capital of the World and the star. The smaller clubs are needed to develop talent and without them the entertainment field can't exist.

The fault lies in the person behind the star who is trying to get an extra dollar whenever contract time comes around.

If this condition continues and the showrooms aren't filled for each show look for the hotel owners to give up on signing name stars and go for

spectaculars without names. Extravaganzas have to run at least six months before the hotel breaks even. Props, scenery and costumes run very high these days and this makes the difference.

Keeping prices reasonable and dress informal and at the same time offering the excitement of Las Vegas is the key to success.

Wilson brings out that where the big hotels in Las Vegas, Reno and Lake Tahoe have gambling, the problem isn't so acute. He states, "We in the east can't afford some of the top cafe stars any more and we will have to go to Nevada to see them."
