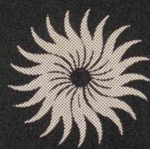

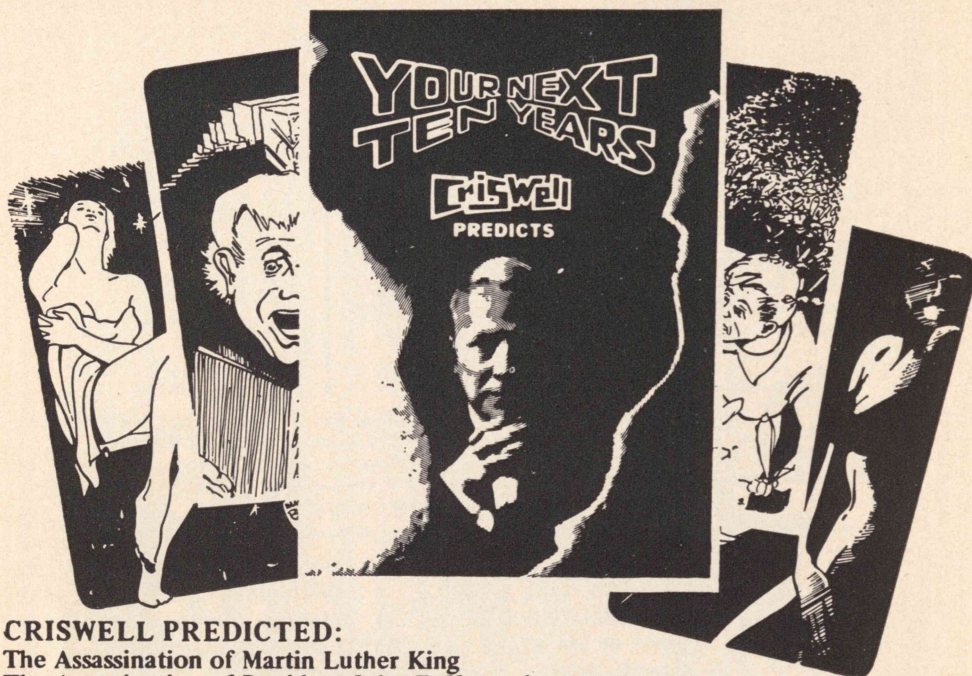

LAS VEGAS—A Hollywood source claims that Dean Martin, one of the five biggest draws along the niter circuit, signed the contract as the opening attraction of the new Grand Hotel due to open on or about Jan. 15, 1974.

MGM execs were shooting for an Oct. 31 opening date but a cement strike intervened halting construction on the biggest resort hotel in the world.

Last year Martin got a release from the Riviera Hotel and it stipulated that he was not to play the Entertainment Capital of the World until '74. He quit there because he only wanted to do one show a night, but now will do two shows a night. This pillar tried to check out what happened to Martin's supposed signed pact with Caesars Palace but was unable to do so.

Martin's personal manager Herman Citreon says the singer never signed any contract with Caesars Palace or any other Strip hotel other than the Riviera Hotel.

Harvey Silbert, board chairman of the Riviera is holding an iron clad contract with Martin through Feb. '74 and may relax it as Meshulam Riklis has purchased the Riviera Hotel for an Oct. takeover, or sooner.

There's been some speculation on what kind of salary the famed singer will receive when the switch becomes effective. People on the in say Grand Hotel will have to pay Martin anywhere from \$150,000 to \$200,000 a week.

The insider claims Dean signed to play six weeks a year on a three year deal. The star also receives a three picture MGM deal over the same period. Film pact calls for a percentage, but not the hotel.

Kirk Kerkorian, Fred Benninger and Jim Aubrey will go all out to sign any star they think will do SRO business for the new \$107 million complex.

A top talent agent says that the Grand Hotel is prepared to pay any price asked by various stars like Elvis Presley, Frank Sinatra, Shecky Greene, Don Rickles, Jackie Gleason and others.

In order to pay the high asking salaries for various stars, the showroom has to be filled every performance and John Q. Public can't afford the price asked for the show.

Should the salaries keep rising, many of the hotels will have to give up on name stars and go for spectaculars without names, which we predicted would happen a couple of years ago.

By paying the stars high salaries the various hotels are leaving themselves wide open and this is a good way to go broke.

WHEELIN' 'N DEALIN' — Tropicana Hotel top bossman Deil Gustafson has purchased Carousel in Casino Center and should be getting his license shortly . . . Goldie Hawn just

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can't wait for her return engagement at Las Vegas Hilton. She'll rest for a few weeks and then on to Yugoslavia for a movie . . . Sally Struthers has resumed working in "All In The Family." She also has a future nitery date at Caesars Palace . . . 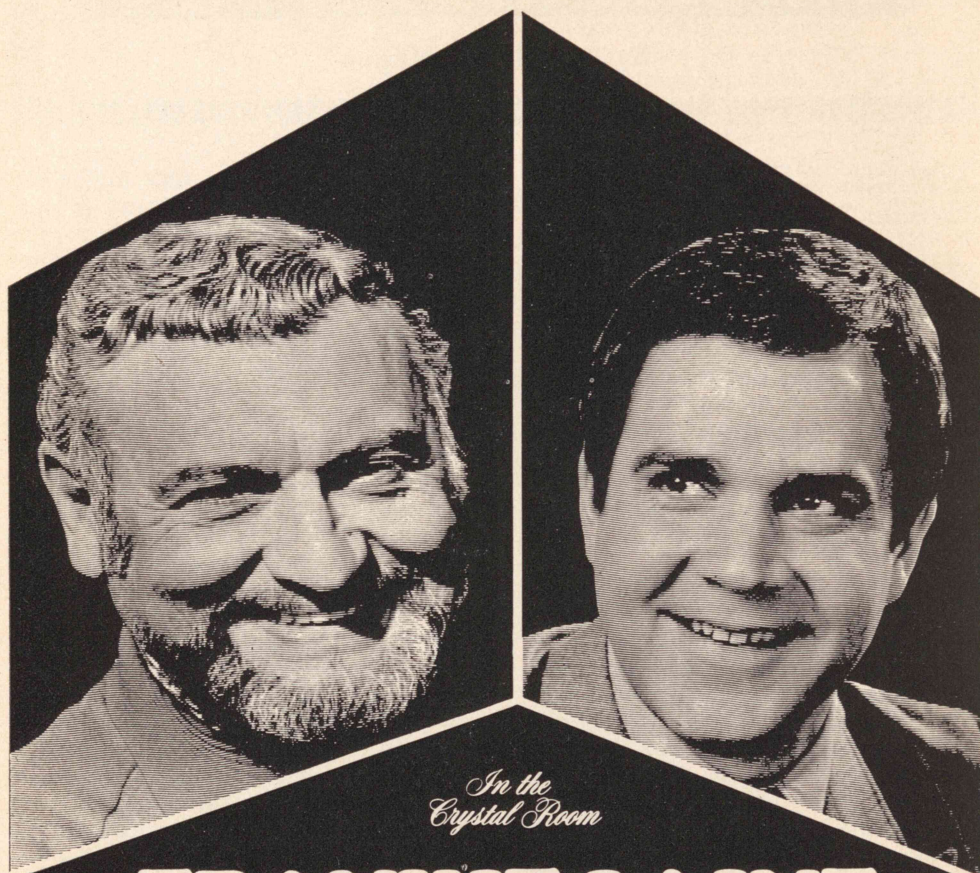
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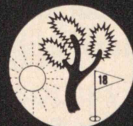


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LET IT BE ME!
