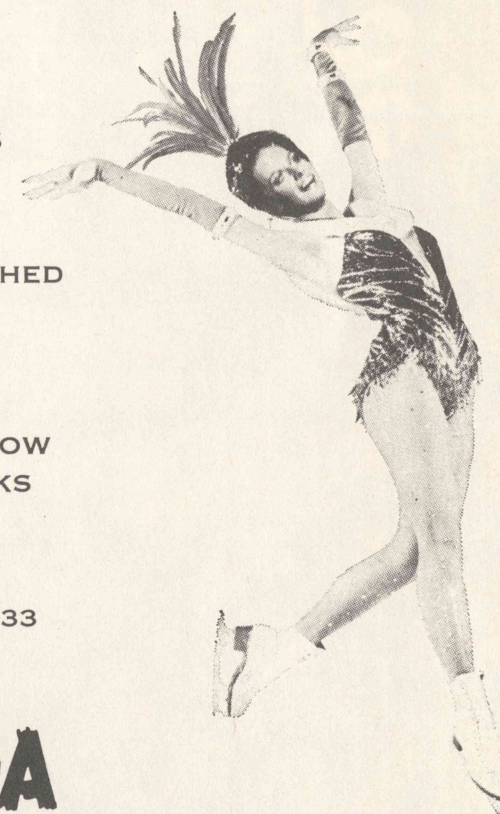

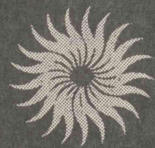

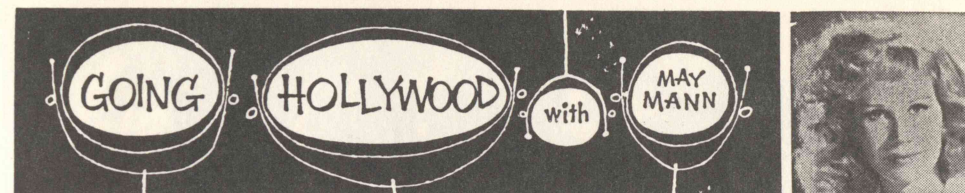

Lights of Las Vegas

Tony Sandler and **Ralph Young**, a blend as smooth as any gin and tonic, will return with comedy star **Red Buttons** to the **Flamingo Hilton** on Aug. 30 for a four week engagement.

Sandler and **Young's** rise to stardom on ballads and easy sounds is considered somewhat of a phenomenon in an industry dominated by hard-rock singers and acid bands.

But statistics don't lie and according to **Capitol Records**, the talented twosome rank among **Capitol's** biggest selling stars with eight albums to their credit. All they need right now is one top hit to carry them to the top.

Now past their fourth year as main showroom headliners, **Sandler** and **Young** rank among the most unlikely performers to ever emerge as big-time stars.

Their gentle harmonies constitute a welcome change from the thundering tempos of contemporary Top 40 music. Soothing ballads and softly flowing melodies are **Sandler** and **Young** trademarks.

As a team they have made great strides in the entertainment field by blending the talents of one suave European (**Sandler**) and a New Yorker (**Young**) with an infectious personality.

And, in an age when male singing teams are virtually unheard of, the genial duo has continued to win thousands of dedicated fans throughout the country. They also have a number of fan clubs to help their popularity.

The duo met in Italy in 1963 while rehearsing for a revue. They became instant friends and as they worked together more and more, they decided to develop some special material for themselves.

Doing one of their numbers one night at a party a producer in attendance liked it so much he signed them up for another revue. It was at this point that they de-

cided to pursue their careers together and it's been a steady climb upward since then.

Buttons is one of the most gifted and versatile performers in show business. This is a sort of comeback for him on the nitery circuit.

In 1952, **Buttons** launched his own television show, which ran for three seasons to top ratings. Some of his lines, such as "Strange things are happening" entered the idiom of the time and he won a **Michael Award** (later renamed "**Emmy**") as the best comedian of 1953. Four years later he won an **Academy Award (Oscar)** performing the most poignant tragedy in the film "**Sayonara**."

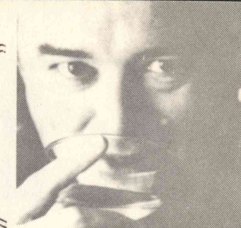

Los Angeles, California is one of the world's most interesting cities! The only problem is it is so massive in size that the average citizen just gives in and refuses to get out and look for the unusual.

I spend a great deal of my spare time looking for the unusual as well as interesting people. Three years ago I heard about a robust bearded fellow by the name of **Sam Pierson**. I could not wait to go out to visit Los Angeles' new vintner. Yes, **Sam** had opened the first winery in the city in 50 years. The **Nave Pierson Winery** is situated near the railroad yards in an industrial area. **Sam** gave up a promising career as a photographer to do what he liked best, making wine.

I visited with **Sam** one afternoon and he won me over with his wares, as well as his knowledge of food and his gusto for life. Last week I returned to the original winery to have lunch with the **Piersons** and sample their new delicatessen goodies as well as taste **Sam's** new improved wines. The tasting room has been enlarged, along with the staff. **Denise**, the everloving wife of **Sam** is in charge of the kitchen with an able assistant. Soups, salads, sandwiches and cheese cakes are prepared before your eyes. Wine and other beverages, are available for you to enjoy.

The patio is next to the winery and is friendly and charming. As you enjoy your repast, you can watch the trains go by. As soon as I arrived, **Sam** started pouring. For two hours we sampled all his wines as well as **Denise's** culinary arts. We talked of the grape harvest, the recipe contest and cooking seminar that he is conducting at the winery. I will be a judge as well as a demonstrator. Naturally all recipes will use wine as an ingredient. If **Nave Pierson** wines are not

available at your liquor store, your dealer may order them for you. You will be amazed how good they are and how reasonable. Here is one of **Denise Pierson's** favorite recipes.

DENISE'S APRICOT PORK LOIN

1 8lb. pork loin
1 fifth bottle Apricot wine
1 8oz. bottle Apricot preserves
3 oz. white wine vinegar
1 oz. soya sauce
salt and pepper to taste

Prepare roast as usual. Mix Apricot preserves, vinegar, soya sauce, salt and pepper in a bowl. Remove roast from oven the last five minutes left to cook. Cover roast with the Apricot mixture. Return to oven. This lets the glaze set. As roast is carved pour one tablespoon Apricot Wine over each serving.

The **Nave Pierson Winery** has the best dessert wines I have tasted in a long time. My favorites are the Plum, Apricot, Strawberry and May wines. As we tasted more of **Sam's** wines he gave me this recipe.

1 fifth Zinfandel wine
¼ cup soya sauce
½ cup wine vinegar, garlic flavored
¼ cup honey (more if you desire a sweeter
marinate)
4 cloves of garlic, crushed
3 tbs. salt
1 onion, coarsely chopped

Blend all ingredients together. Cut meat in one inch squares. Place meat in marinate. Leave unrefrigerated for two days. Place meat on a skewer alternating with tomatoes, bell peppers, pineapple, mushrooms, water chestnuts and onions. Slightly saute the mushrooms, bell peppers and onions before using them. Place skewers over Bar-b-que grill and cook. Judge the time to your preference of cooking meat.

Sam never meets a stranger and always has a greeting for each person that walks through the doors at the wine tasting room. The wine casks are in a building to the rear. A tour of the facilities is always welcomed by all the staff. On Sunday the winery offers Jazz sessions. If you are an instrumentalist you are welcomed to sit in for a set or two. Pottery, candles, assorted glasses and carafes are also available. There is something at the Nave Pierson Winery for everyone. Sam now has another tasting room in the Marina area of Los Angeles. Jim Hallock has a pottery studio there, and not only sells his wares, but gives lessons in pottery as well. Each month the winery sends out a news letter. One of the regular customers Joel Schwarz shared a recipe with all the subscribers. Now I pass it on to you.

JOEL SCHWARZ' PLUM FIZZ

7 oz. Plum wine (Nave Pierson, of course)
1 egg white
1 tsp. powdered sugar (optional)
5 ice cubes
1 jigger vodka or gin

Jeanine loved seeing "Peyton Place," the famed Cafe de Paris, the stars dressing rooms, Shirley Temple's bungalow, frosted with my stories of Marilyn Monroe, Betty Grable, Tyrone Power and the great stars of 20th Century Fox. Then we drove by Jayne Mansfield's Pink Palace on Sunset to find the new owners have painted it white and have taken the letters J.M. off the big black iron gates. They have covered the front gate with ivy vines since fans and movie tour buses were making the stop point to look. Tony Curtis' house behind Jayne's now belongs to Sonny and Cher. As we drove up Roxbury, who is getting out of her car at that precise second but Lucille Ball! And her husband gentlemanly was helping her out of their car — as a gentleman should!

Jeanine had brought along her news clippings and her photographs thinking that once in a studio you are in. I had to explain that agents have to be employed to get a girl screen roles and commercials. First requisite is: Get a good agent! In the Jayne book, Jayne tells how she often went hungry, how she sold candy bars and cooking wear door to door for months before anything happened. And how she tried everything just to see inside 20th Century Fox but could never get one foot inside the studio. Then she went disguised as a journalist and did get in, only to be invited out, immediately, since her press credentials had not been certified. Jeanine realized how lucky she was. Opening night, with such sparklers as Liza Minnelli, Petula Clark and Phyllis McGuire in the throng, one fan rushed up to stage edge to give Elvis a trophy — receiving a hug in return — and another handed him what looked like a glass jar of home-made fruit juice. Such is the folksy warmth Presley projects . . . Of course the well-known sex appeal is all there too, triggering squeals when he swings a hip to "Houn' Dog" or inflames with his "Fever." . . . Changes of pace are Elvis' beautiful "American Trilogy," with projected historical slides and a thrilling flute solo by Jimmy Mulidore, and "How Great Thou Art" featuring J. D. Sumner and the Stamps Quartet. Those excellent singers, plus Kathy Westmoreland and the Sweet Inspirations, also back the star's numbers . . . Popular Jackie Kahane's act builds to sure-fire bits including his hilarious "cuckoo test" and a segment on astrology during which the comedy star gives fast, funny readings on the signs called out to him by members of the audience. Kahane's wit is equalled only by his memory! . . . The Sweet Inspirations' zingy vocal turn peaks with a powerful, memorable Billie Holiday medley illustrated by dramatic pictures of the lady.
