The Ruby Amie-Pilot Papers (approximately 1930s-2002) contains newspaper clippings about events in West Las Vegas, Nevada, family photographs, and a memorial program from Robbie Tyler's memorial service. Also included in the collection are newspaper clippings containing a portion of the cartoon series her son Ronald Terry Amie published in the *Las Vegas Voice* and articles about public commissions of his art work for North Las Vegas. Ruby Amie-Pilot moved to Las Vegas in 1952 and worked at the Desert Inn and was the first African American full-time salesperson at Sears in Las Vegas, Nevada.
