Biographical Note

Dr. Linda Karen Miller has helped keep the legacy of Helen Stewart, early Las Vegas, Nevada pioneer, alive since 2003.

Linda Miller was born in Kansas and started teaching in the K-12 school system in both Kansas and Virginia during the 1970s. Miller focused on social studies and often wore costumes to emphasize her lessons. Miller moved to Las Vegas, Nevada in 2002 and discovered the letters of Helen Stewart in 2003 and soon began performing as Helen Stewart. In 2010, Dr. Miller was in charge of fundraising the remaining money necessary for building a statue of Helen J. Stewart at the Old Mormon Fort in Nevada. By 2012, she had completed the project and the statue of Stewart was erected. As of 2020, Miller continues to appear as Stewart in her educational outreach program, *Reflections of Early Las Vegas as told by Helen J. Stewart*, across Southern Nevada. Sources:
