programs, advertising posters, fliers, long playing record albums, photograph slides, and restaurant menus. This material was formerly known as the International Show Programs Collection.

#### **Historical Note**

The first cabaret music halls opened in Paris, France in the 1880s. Featuring music, dance, and drama, they were held at venues that included a stage, tables for the audience, and often a Master of Ceremonies. Folies-Bergère was built as an opera house in the 1860s and evolved into a cabaret music hall in the 1880s. The Moulin Rouge opened in 1889. The Casino de Paris became a cinema and music hall in the early twentieth-century. Le Lido de Paris, featuring cabaret and burlesque,

opened in 1946. These venues served as stages for performers such as Édith Piaf, Mistinguett, and the American-born Josephine Baker.
