Abstract: The Rita Deanin Abbey Exhibition Catalogs (1975-1991) are

comprised primarily of exhibition catalogs featuring Abbey's art at various museums and international exhibitions including the Palm Springs Desert Museum, the University of New Mexico Art Museum, Biennale Internationale d'Email Laval, and

Art Museum, Biennale Internationale d'Email Laval, and the International Exhibition of Enamelling Art in Japan. The collection also contains invitations to Abbey's art shows at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas as well as a copy of Abbey's curriculum vitae. Also included are select issues of *Leonardo*, *International Journal of the Contemporary Artist* featuring artists'

notes written by Abbey.

Biographical Note

Rita Deanin Abbey is a professor emeritus of art at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas (UNLV). Abbey has both a bachelor of fine arts degree and a masters of arts degree from the University of New Mexico in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Abbey is a painter, printmaker, enamelist, and sculptor who taught in the Department of Art at Nevada Southern University (which became UNLV) from 1965 to 1987. At UNLV, Abbey taught classes in drawing, painting, and color theory

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and also developed interdisciplinary classes with the science department. Some of Abbey's art on display around Las Vegas, Nevada include: Spirit Tower, a 20-foot tall cor-ten steel sculpture at the Summerlin Library; the sixteen Isaiah Stained-Glass Windows in the main sanctuary of Temple Beth Sholom; the bust of Flora Dungan in the Humanities building at UNLV; and a plexiglass mural in one of the University Medical Center buildings on Charleston Boulevard. Abbey also made Wall of Creation, a twenty by forty foot mural made of polyester resin and fiberglass, for Temple Beth Sholom's former synagogue on Oakey Boulevard.
