Organizational History

American Institute for Graphic Arts (AIGA) Las Vegas was started in 1996 and officially founded in 1997. The chapter supports designers and creative entities in Las Vegas region by organizing events such as lectures, competitions, and social events. AIGA Las Vegas provides education, support, and networking assistance to both professionals and students. The main AGIA was

founded in 1914, and remains the oldest and largest professional membership organization for design. It is now known as "AGIA, the professional association for design."
