He discusses the establishment of the UNLV Foundation and how that fund-raising arm has improved the financial health of the university. He also discusses challenges the university faced during his tenure as president, including the "code controversy" in 1981, the economic recession of the early 1980s, and issues surrounding race relations and equity. He then describes his career as a university professor after stepping down from the presidency in 1984 and his retirement in 2000. Digital audio available; no transcript available.
