She then talks about the formalization that occurred in the Jewish community with the building of Temple Beth Sholom. Kane discusses how her parents got in the liquor business, and Boulder City, Nevada laws against liquor during Boulder (Hoover) Dam construction. In a second session, Kane recalls the Wildcat Lair, a gathering spot of students from Las Vegas High School in the 1950s. Lastly, she gives a brief overview of her fifty-six years of living in Hawaii and how after all those years she and her husband returned to live in Las Vegas. Digital audio and transcript available.
