Historical Background

Blue Diamond Village, which is about twenty miles southwest of Las Vegas, Nevada and was originally called Cottonwood Springs, served as a stop on the Old Spanish Trail for traders traveling between Santa Fe, New Mexico and California in the mid-nineteenth century. The Paiute people used the area for agriculture. In 1923, the Blue Diamond Materials Company of California purchased the land, renamed the town, and began mining operations for gypsum. Blue Diamond Village became a company town, used exclusively by miners and auxiliary businesses run by the company. The company began selling workers' housing to the public in 1965. Sources:
